Food For Thought



Where to this time, near or far?
We had a brain wave, its years since we have been to the Lord Moreton and we heard that things had changed since our last visit, about ten years ago I think. Well it had changed and as we found out, it had changed for the better.

First off a pint of Station Bitter for myself and a small glass of house red for my wife. The bitter was in excellent condition which put me in a good mood for starters. My wife enjoyed the house red so that was a plus. We were shown to our table by a very smart polite young man.

The menu was much as we expected for an eatery of this type. All starters were under £5 and main courses under £10. On receiving our starters we were pleasantly surprised by the size of the portions, really good value for money. My wife chose nachos whilst I opted for mushrooms in Stilton sauce. The mushrooms came in a soup type bowl which was brim full, piping hot and in a really tasty sauce. My wife went for the poached salmon which came with a wonderful salad and buttered new potatoes, so many she couldn't eat them all! I am of the view that fish and chips should only be eaten out of newspaper (or similar) but on this occasion I decided against my rule and went for fish and chips with mushy peas. Again it was a good size portion and piping hot and on a hot plate. My wife declared herself too full for a pudding, but I went for the sticky toffee pudding. When it arrived my wife's eyes popped out of her head at the size of the portion and the waiter immediately brought us another spoon without being asked. Nice touch. A very pleasant evening which cost just over £40.

The only down side was a family with a small child under school age who (in our opinion as it was 8.45pm) should have been in bed. Instead, he was allowed to run round making a lot of noise and was being encouraged by one of the adults with him. This struck us as disruptive for other diners and potentially dangerous to himself and others given that waiting staff were dashing round with hot food. Not thoughtful or considerate!

Dear Editor.

St Martins residents are fed up with cleaning children's shoes and pushchair wheels.

Thoughtless dog walkers, usually at night or early morning, let their dog poo on the pavement, and don't pick it up.

In Spain, police ask you to show you have a bag if you have a dog with you. Instant 100 euro fine and name and address taken and if it happens 3 times you are in court. Police stop their car at any time and ask you to show you have a bag.

Maybe we should think of looking at all bye-laws in respect of dogs and start to enforce them.

Let us have people watching out at night for offenders, and let the dog warden know who the irresponsible owners are.

Under the clean neighbourhoods and environment act 2005, it is illegal not to clean up after your dog in areas to which the public have access and offenders could be issued with a fixed penalty notice of £80. Designated council officers and police community

support officers can issue fixed penalty notices on the spot, however fixed penalty notices can also be issued if a witness statement is received from anyone who may have seen the offence being committed. Please note that council officers and housing officers will be carrying out surveillance and visits to St Martins.





FRIENDS OF IFTON MEADOWS

From time to time, you may recall, the management committee of Ifton Meadows turn their attention to the birch trees on the site. These are a mixed blessing. As a so-called pioneer species they are extremely good at colonising recently cleared ground, such as the old coal tip that underlies the Meadows. Left to their own devices





these hardy, shallow rooted trees with their abundant and efficiently distributed seeds would soon take over the entire site. Pretty as this might be, as a nature reserve we need to maintain a variety of habitats in order to support as wide arrange of species as possible. So birch trees on the hilltop we call the Skylark Mound need to be strictly controlled to maintain the grassland that encourages the ground nesting skylarks.

Conversely, birch trees in the right place are both attractive to look at and are closely associated with the growth of several types of fungi. They are sometimes known as "the lady of the woods" but they need room to grow gracefully. In the far corner of the Meadows is the flattish area we call the Birch Field, where there are numerous silver birch trees. In order to encourage the growth of fine mature "ladies" we have been beginning to cut back the scrubby specimens to give the maturing trees the space they need. We also need to encourage the development of a succession – some older trees, some middle aged ones and some younger ones that will eventually take over as the older trees reach the end of their 50-60 year life span.

Across the world birch trees of over fifty different types grow widely in northern temperate and arctic regions. Their timber is not generally highly valued, but native North Americans traditionally used the bark to make their canoes. In this country the wood used to be used for making charcoal but is now more commonly utilised for flooring and plywood. It has



been found that birch trees contain the chemical betulin. Hence the botanical name for silver birch – betula pendula. Betulinic acid has been found to act against malaria and HIV and extracts from birch have been used to treat snakebites.

Stop Loan Sharks

Anyone can be a victim of a loan shark – your family, friends, neighbours and even you.

It's not always easy to spot a loan shark as they come in all shapes and sizes and will at first appear friendly, just part of the community. It is when you can't pay that they will turn on you.

A loan shark is someone who lends cash as an unauthorised business.

If someone is struggling to pay a debt the loan shark will resort to threats, violence and intimidation to get what he thinks you owe, even if the debt has been paid off several times over.

A loan shark will typically have little paperwork and will add penalty charges for late payments. Sometimes they will add random sums to the bill.

Many victims keep paying because they think they can afford the agreed weekly sum, but they don't realise how much their continuing weekly payments add up to or they are to afraid to stop payments.

Our advice is that you should never go to a loan shark. They do not provide a community service; they are simply out to make money.

Loan sharks:

- Are running an unauthorised business under the Financial Services and Markets Act 2000
- Often refuse to tell the borrower how much they still owe, or when they will finish repayments.
- Often increase the debt or add additional amounts.
- May take items as security including passports, bank cards and driving licences.
- May resort to violence, threats and intimidation.

What is being done to stop this?

The Illegal Money Lending Team investigates illegal money lending and any related offences- in the past this has included violence, blackmail, drugs offences, threats, kidnap and even rape.

Mikes Story

Aged 17, Mike was keen to buy his first car. When Peter offered to lend him £250, Mike agreed and began paying back in instalments until the loan was repaid. It was only then that Peter mentioned additional interest. Mike wasn't expecting this and found it difficult to repay, so Peter offered him a further loan to pay off the first.

This became a cycle and continued over the next two decades, which Mike described as "Sheer hell". He was trapped in a never ending spiral of debt, and struggled to get by, despite working two jobs. He would make large repayments but his outstanding balance would never drop below £9,000.

Over the years Mike paid a staggering £90,000 to the loan shark, all from an initial loan of £250.

This had a hugely detrimental impact on Mike and his family. The loan shark attacked Mike in front of his children, he lost his home as he couldn't pay the mortgage and three jobs due to depression. Aged 33, he suffered a stress-related heart attack.

On more than one occasion, Mike attempted suicide.

"You wouldn't wish it on anybody" He said "It affected my relationship with my wife. If I wasn't at work I was home arguing, and it affected the kids. They had nothing. Every

Friday and Saturday he was sat outside my work - if I finished late he would text saying 'its payday where are you'. It was a living nightmare"

The turning point was when Mike spotted an article in his local paper about a loan shark who had been prosecuted by the Team.

Peter was now threatening to harm Mike's wife and realising he couldn't take any more Mike called the confidential hotline.

From that point forwards Mike was supported and Peter was prosecuted and imprisoned.

"I wish I'd known there was somewhere to go years ago" Mike said "The Team were fantastic, they offered so much support, and every promise they made they delivered. It was such a relief when I found out Peter was arrested and then put in prison. I nearly broke down when the Team rang to say"

Mike is now looking to the future, and has a message to anyone in the grips of a loan shark.

"I would tell anyone who is borrowing from a loan shark to be confident to stand up and speak out- the Team will support you the whole way. Even a year later the Team are always there for me, regularly in touch and always on the end of the phone.

Life is absolutely fantastic now- we don't have to worry about money anymore and I'm happier than I've ever been. Were going on holiday as a family for the first time in 17 years - I can't imagine ever being able to do this before

Contacting the Team is the best thing I could ever have done. I'm living the life I should be living"
