Well Football is finished (thankfully). Wimbledon has it's new champion (Well Done Andy), British Grand Prix (Lewis did it again) what next. The Olympics in Rio, if you like sport what a summer you're having. If you don't like sport, well you're having a pretty torrid time as far as telly viewing goes. The weather is up and down, so little time for the garden and very little opportunities to sit out and soak up the sunshine. (As I edit this article the heat is overwhelming so you might well be soaking up the sunshine as you read this or not!) To cap it all the EU Referendum. Whether you agreed with the result or not the country seems in a state of flux which make it an uncertain time for everyone. Change will happen whatever, whether or not for the better has yet to be seen.

Your Council will continue to serve the community, appraising the county officers of any issues that happen in the village. With a greatly reduced workforce it is not surprising that things can easily slip under the radar. We all need to be vigilant in what is going on around us. If there is something different happening that you are not sure about, ie footings for buildings appearing, hedges being up-rooted, ditches being blocked, manhole covers missing or standing proud of surfaces to name but a few things, please do contact me or email our clerk. We can't always do anything about it other than letting the authority know and get the issue noted and hopefully addressed.

We are still looking at what more can our council do to keep the village looking clean and tidy when the county's maintenance contracts run out in 2018. One thing we have said is that we are reasonable happy to take on the grass and hedge cutting of the Public Open Spaces (POS) but we feel that if the community's money is being spent on such things then it is only reasonable that the community should own the ground. County has offered a 125 year lease but we believe that this council should have the freehold to the land with an agreement that we could never sell the land for building purposes or any other reason.

Again, we are looking at the War Memorial and how we might preserve the names that are slowly but surely being eroded by the weather and will be lost in due time. We do have one or two avenues to explore but I wonder if any one in the community has any ideas? Please get in contact if you do.

Report from St Martins Parish Council Clerk

The July meeting was held in The Community Centre St Martins.

Mark Blount, Parks & Greenspace Team Leader from Shropshire Council attended the meeting to explain the current position over possible devolved services from Shropshire Council to parish/town councils. The Parish Council said they are very interested in taking on the Public Open Spaces within their area, but only on a freehold basis. As regards the Local Nature Reserve at Ifton Meadows, Shropshire Council have stated that they have an annual Controllable Site Budget for this area of £11494. Shropshire Council has now agreed that to retain the Country Parks and Countryside Heritage Sites within the Council, safeguarding the sites such as Ifton Meadows for the future, they would have to generate more income and work towards a cost neutral position. If this is not met, then the service will continue to be at risk. Again concern was expressed over the development on land west of Cottage Lane. When this planning application was granted in 2015 a number of conditions were placed on it prior to the dwellings being first occupied. Our local Councillor Steve Davenport has not been able to obtain any satisfactory statement about what is happening on this development site, therefore it was agreed to write to Clive Wright, Chief Executive of Shropshire Council and their Leader Malcolm Pate asking as a matter of urgency what action is being taken, or is planned to be taken by Shropshire Council to ensure that this developer adheres to and fully complies with the conditions imposed on the approved planning application.

The Annual RoSPA inspection of the play areas took place at the end of June. A number of Councillors attended this inspection to discuss with the inspector a recent accident that resulted in a young boy suffering a bruised forehead from the skate park gate. The inspector's conclusion was that the most likely cause was misuse of that gate and concluded that there was only a low risk that such an accident would be repeated. However the Parish Council have agreed to reduce the risk by replacing the gate with a fixed metal fence of the same type used around the skate park, but set at a 90° angle to the perimeter fence at that point. This fence would terminate at least 90cm from the garden hedge and be acceptable from a health and safety viewpoint.

Members made no comment on two planning applications that were due for consideration which were as follows; Erection of two storey side extension following demolition of existing single

storey ground floor extension at Heathfields, 3 Baytree Avenue, St Martins and the erection of an extension to existing building to provide additional workshop; relocation of car park and formation of concrete service yard and associated works at Ridgway Rentals, Earthmover House, Ridgway Business Park, Ifton Heath, St Martins.

Again a number of residents expressed an interest in filling the casual vacancy on the parish council following the resignation of Brian Latham who has moved away from the area. After a secret ballot Andrew Cast of Devonia, Fach Lane, St Martins was elected and will attend our next meeting on the 8th September 2016.

There is no Parish Council meeting in August. Therefore the next meeting of the parish council will be a Full Council Meeting on Thursday 8th September 2016 at 7.00 pm in the The Moors Centre.




The committee would like to thank all the people in St. Martin's who supported the Club in one way or another and hope for their continued support next season.

Married to a CFR

Life is never dull when you have a spouse who volunteers as a Community First Responder for the West Midlands Ambulance Service. Many of you will now be familiar with the sight of the silver ambulance car (which is often the first WMAS vehicle on the scene when a local 999 call is made) and its two drivers, John Roberts and Effie Cadwallader. As Effie's husband, I know only too well how important their


volunteering is and how it is frequently far from simple. When she is on call, which is normally from 07.00 to 14.00, Effie has her radio with her at all times ready to answer a summons from control at a moment's notice. That means she might be called out in the middle of our lunch, when we are busy in the garden, when she is preparing a meal or even when we are shopping in Stan's. It's not unusual for me to be left to look after the cakes which are in the oven or deal with the washing which is ready to be hung out. I'm quite used to being abandoned in Stan's with a couple of bags of shopping to carry home and I've even been chased around the store by staff passing on the message that she's had to respond to a call somewhere.

Although she and John are primarily meant to be responding in St Martins, they are often called out further afield. I remember one Sunday when she was sent to Oswestry at about 11.00 and I got a call from her at 14.30 to say that she was finally on her way back from somewhere in the wilds near Llansillin. As so often happens, she had been moved on from the original incident to another one even further distant.

I may even end up with an unofficial role in the volunteer process. Our area of North Shropshire is not noted for the logic of its addresses or the accuracy of Satnavs and postcodes and she sometimes has to ring me to consult Google maps and other online sources to find a location. All too often, the satnav leads her to a collection of houses and she has to find the right one, which is not easy if each one is not clearly named. Just recently, she went to the other side of Oswestry to an address she knows, only to be sent on to somewhere else in the Trefonen area. Cue phone call to me to try to find the second location and I ended up talking her through remote country lanes until she was near to her destination, an exercise not assisted by the inevitable loss of mobile signal along the way. She can get guidance by radio from the ambulance control based in Brierley Hill, but it can be easier for her to rely on a spouse who knows the area better and can cope with names like Sodyllt or Rhosygadfa!

Being an occasional route-finder is the limit of my assistance: I could not do *any* of the things which she and John are called upon to do and which I know are much appreciated by many people, especially here in St Martins. When she has a callout, she never knows exactly what she will find when she gets there. Volunteering calls for a cool head, a little medical knowledge, personal initiative, compassion and, not infrequently, a strong stomach. I could not do it, but both she and John can.

Incidentally, some people seem to confuse me with John. I am married to Effie but not a CFR. John is a CFR but not married to Effie.




We'll be offering our thoughts on the novel at Jill's house. We've had quite a successful and fun year and would look forward to having new


