### **St Martins School Community**

Since last October, the Governors and I have been investigating the benefits of an Academy conversion for St Martins School. The advantages of belonging to a Multi Academy Trust for our small school are numerous. Because we are such a small 'all through' school, from time to time we need to seek specialist advice, support and collaboration, and since I took over as Head in May 2014, we have worked with a number of schools and the Local Authority. As the Local Authority is reducing its capacity, it was necessary to secure the support we need for the future.

We investigated and evaluated many possibilities but have finally been offered the chance to join The Priory School Trust led by Michael Barratt. This is the best possible outcome for our students. The Priory School is a teaching school in Shrewsbury and has frequently had the best academic results in Shropshire. Their ethos and values are remarkably similar to ours, and as a team we will move forward with a shared wealth of educational expertise and best practice in all areas of the school.

The team at St Martins will remain the same and the day to day running of the school will not feel very different. We will keep our special identity, school uniform, logo, name and our small school family friendliness. We will gain from the vast experience of a talented and successful team in helping to ensure that St Martins School becomes an outstanding, aspirational School for our community.

There have been a number of meetings as part of the formal consultation to discuss the conversion to Academy status. Now we are all really excited by this fantastic opportunity and cannot wait to get started.

# Funding success for Qube Social Group

Qube is thrilled to have been awarded funding from the Morgan Foundation to continue their popular social group and shopping services for the next three years. Since 2011 Qube has been running a successful social group as part of the CHUMS project which offers people the opportunity to make new friends and try out activities ranging from exercise classes to flower arranging. The group has been a real lifeline to people feeling lonely and isolated in Oswestry and surrounding areas and has helped many people feel connected with their community again.

Whilst CHUMS sadly closed in June, Qube will move forward with this new funding to run the social group weekly rather than monthly, creating the opportunity for even more people to come and join in. Victoria Hughes, Co-ordinator of the social group and shopping services at Qube reports "I am delighted that we can now run the social group weekly as loneliness is such an important issue to tackle. Our group is full of laughter and we





always welcome new faces. I want people to know that if they turn up at Qube on a Tuesday morning they can expect a warm welcome from great friends".






The girls planned their menus and the activities they would like to do while there. There was one



### FRUIT CAKE

4 oz soft margarine

4 oz castor sugar 12 oz mixed dried fruit

2 eggs

1/2 cup of milk



Shropshire Wheels 2Work helps Three Parishes residents get to work

Residents of Weston Rhyn, St Martins and Gobowen could be eligible for a two-wheeled transport loan if they are struggling to get to work.

Wheels2Work, managed by The Shropshire Rural Communities Charity, currently offers low cost scooter, electric bike or push bike loans along with transport advice and support with car maintenance to help people find or keep employment.



One Wheels2Work client, Eoin Blakeway, says, "it's been a worthwhile thing. I'm home



from work in half an hour, not having to rely on two buses, which were not even available on Sundays or late evenings". Eoin also says that, consequently, the scheme had enabled him to do extra hours at work.

The scheme now helps around 200 people each year to find or stay in work and increase their independence, whilst helping businesses in the county to recruit and retain staff.
