## 2016 has been the Year of The House and it is nearly over.

How casual was the remark from a friend, "Why don't you build your own on the garden?" when we were discussing downsizing for our senior years. Sounds like a great idea, doesn't it?

We think we have had it relatively easy, mainly due to choosing the best builders in the whole world. From lifting of the first turf to near-completion has been 10 months of almost non-stop work.

Would that we could be as complimentary about the utility companies or the council, both of whose fees have added significantly to our costs and thereby limited our original plans.

When one moves to a house, even a new build, one compromises: we want 3 bedrooms so we can live with that kitchen, don't like the bath but the garden is the right size, etc. Where does one start when building one's own? Our architect was a huge help just getting us going: look at what you have now, consider what you would like better, make a wish list and we'll go from there.

We had to have 3 bedrooms to accommodate the family coming back to visit.

We have always lived in our kitchen and like the space so we measured what we have and kept that.

The house is to be for our senior years so downstairs we needed a shower room and a separate room that could be used as a bedroom later.

The rest was the detailed wish list.

The architect came up with a design. We couldn't afford it. Houses are charged by the square foot ... then you double it! He sucked it all in which made it rise, of course, and the staircase which we wanted to be straight (Effie has struggled to carry too many elderly patients down twisting staircases) had to be curved. Ah well, compromise!

There was then a long pause as we sought planning permission and tried to find the right builder. We quickly discovered that few builders are interested in individual projects, but we

stumbled upon Colin who runs Tai Dyfi Homes, a small timber-frame building company, in mid-Wales. As soon as we met him we knew we had the right man.

On 10<sup>th</sup> December last year we took a deep breath, signed the contract and poured a huge drink. We have not regretted it, though three months later, when the digger tore the turf from what had been Effie's mother's carefully tended lawn our stomachs did heave.



Colin's "lads" have toiled from 8.15-4.30 with half an hour for morning break and half an hour for lunch, not a moment more, every day. They have been up to their knees in swilling concrete and mud with the rain lashing down and the roofers were burnt to a crisp during the hottest week of the year, but they would not take even a cup of tea from us. We have been regularly consulted along the way about everything with pros and cons spelled out and alternative costings provided. We quickly became aware that Colin was a perfectionist and on at least one occasion realised from the look on his face that a choice we had made was not up to his standard. Needless to say, we swiftly had second thoughts.

With his guidance and attention to detail we have managed to keep within budget practically all the way through. Some of the surrounding groundwork has had to be left until "Stage Two" when, we hope, we shall have money available from the sale of our old house. Leaving Comet House after 36+ years will be a wrench, but at least we don't have far to move and we can take our time doing so.

Many of you who are reading this have already been very complimentary about our new house and for this we are most grateful. Our neighbours have been really supportive and to them in particular we extend our thanks publicly, especially as they have suffered most from the inevitable disruption and inconvenience. We don't suppose that they, like us, will forget the day when the frame of the house was delivered on the back of a large lorry and lifted over the hedge into the garden.

With luck we should be in the new house by Christmas, but Effie has already threatened that Christmas dinner will be cooked in the old house to avoid messing up her new cooker. And, in the interests of continuity, we have been allowed to call our new home "Comet Cottage".



## **IMMC/Friends of Ifton Meadows LNR**

Chairman's Report - for November 2015 to September 2016

The December meeting was our usual meal out - 2015 we chose the Greyhound.

Green Gyms: took place 2nd week of each month (weather permitting).

In November we dug out two channels in the silted up pond, allowing the water to flow on either side and making an island in the middle. It is obvious that some of the silting is being caused by coal dust, you could taste it while we were working. Our efforts were rewarded with no flooding despite persistent heavy rain. January we split into two parties one working on the Pen y banc hedge whilst the other group coppiced the growth on one side of the pond allowing light in and reducing the amount of leaves falling into the water. Over the following months work was carried out on the Birch field, Brownie Meadow and other areas. August saw us cutting back and tidying the Colliery entrance.

Drainage Rods have been purchased and used to clear blocked drains. Work on the site is ongoing.

The sale of the Horse field was completed in 2015, some of the land had been sold to Mrs Lewis and the remainder was returned to the site when the lease ended in April 2016. Over the Summer it was left fallow to allow the flora of the site to be monitored. It was then cut in September in time for us to hold an event. Two picnic tables have been placed in the field.

The 'Party at the Meadows' was held on the afternoon of the 10th September. We were joined by the Brownies, St. Martins WI, Scouts and 3 Parish Big Lottery. A grant from the 3 Parish Big Lottery enabled this event to take place. We had 'the Silverman' entertainer, various stalls, barbeque and refreshments. Many thanks to Steve Davenport (barbeque) and the Brownies (refreshments) and WI who very kindly donated their takings to help cover costs. A steady number of people attended and the 'sweep nets' where particularly popular.

Shropshire Council have recovered the path to the Mosaic making it smoother and therefore easier for wheelchairs and buggy's and also removed the bridle gate and straightened out the dog leg at the Colliery entrance making much needed extra car parking. On the down side when they cut the grass it was deposited on site to form an unsightly mound and as we all know grass does not rot down very easily. This is something we must watch in the future.

Following the extreme cutting of the skylark mound last year it has recovered well, numbers of skylarks seem to be down on previous years but hopefully this will improve in 2017. Council have again cut one third, a rotation of one third cut each year is the recommended amount for this type of area.

Unfortunately like many other public areas dog fouling is still a problem, with this in mind we have asked our local councillor to investigate the use of 'Kingdom Security' who have had success reducing litter and dog fouling in the Wrexham area.

In preparation for 2017 over the next few months we shall be looking to make a new 'Management Plan and following up on putting both the Horse and Railway fields officially into the Local Nature Reserve (LNR).

Many thanks to everyone who has supported us over the last 12 months especially 'Pentre Nurseries' who donate the money they make from second hand books to our funds.

Many thanks also to the 'Friends' who work each month both on and off the Meadows. Over the last 12 months we have registered 465 hours of voluntary work and that is only the hours we remembered to write down.

Anyone interested in nature is welcome to both our meetings and Green Gyms.

Coming together as one community on Remembrance Sunday fulfils these principles. It is this coming together as part of a wider community that perhaps accounts for recent newspaper headlines: 'Scouts and Guides grow up to have better mental health'.

A study of adults with a scouting or guiding background found they were less likely to be anxious or depressed in later life. The results might also have something to do with a love of nature and the outdoors that we encourage.

This Christmas we'll be encouraging our young Scouts to think of others in the community, with donations to the foodbank and by keeping an eye on elderly neighbours.

As 2016 draws to a close, we'd like to thank all those organisations who supported our special events this year including The Greyhound who supplied hot soup on our night hike, The Jack Mytton Inn for hosting our summer bike riders and supplying refreshments and Stans Superstore and Wrexham Reptiles for donations towards our bonfire night celebrations.

Keep an eye out for us if you visit Stans on Christmas Eve when we'll be doing our annual bag pack to raise vital funds to keep the group running in your community.
