#### From the Chair

Hello Everyone. I hope you all had a very happy Christmas and are looking forward to an exciting New Year. The switching on of the Christmas Tree Lights was again marred by the weather - it started out dry but as we got going there was a slight drizzle and it just got heavier and heavier. A Big Thank You to all

that managed to stay to the end. Ruby was chosen from a dip in the hat by Paul Milner, Mayor of Oswestry. Thank you Paul for sparing the time in your very busy schedule to come out to the village and give us a hand.

It is not often that I am able to say that Shropshire Council has backed up the Parish Council but in this case I am



happy to say that it is TRUE. Nick Scott contacted our clerk to ask for a meeting with regard to the hedge from the entrance of Hollands Drive up to Garden Village. It was not possible on the date he suggested but we invited him to come to our full council meeting on December 8th and there was a rather long conversation as to the legality of removing the hedge, having placed evidence to prove that the condition laid down by Shropshire Council preventing the removal of the hedge without further planning permission. We left him with no doubt as to general feeling of the council, that as this is a rural village, metal picket fencing is not acceptable as it is more of an urban image. We took our complaint to the planners who agreed with us and wrote to Mr Scott reinforcing the agreed conditions for this development, which included the preservation of the hedge rows.

#### **UNSUNG HEROS**

There are lots of great people in the village that have worked in a voluntary capacity for many years without recognition. The Parish Council would like to change that and recognise the extraordinary efforts that individuals have put in. We have had two in the past, Derek Stokes and Nick Heard, both exceptional men who have given un-numbered hours and days into their chosen areas.

I invite you to nominate our next Unsung Hero by writing a letter to me, Sue Schofield, 6 Greenfields, SY11 3AG, telling me about a person who has gone the extra mile to keep a group going, who continues to input into that group whether for young or for older people. You might think of others who make a real difference in this village for the people of this village. Please don't nominate any parish council member. Your nomination needs to contain contact details for both yourself and the person you are nominating, the group they are involved with and why you think they need a 'pat on the back'. Nominations need to be with me by the 1st of March to be included in the next edition and votes by the 3 April. The award will be given at the Annual Meeting of the Parish on 20th April 2017.

#### Report from St Martins Parish Council Clerk

St Martins Parish Council Report – January 2017

The January Parish Council meeting was held in The Community Centre, St Martins.

With the Christmas and New Year period occurring since the last meeting, this one was very short as there was very little to report.

The Parish Council welcomed Nina Mistry as a new member of the Council. This brings the parish council up to full strength of 15 before the next Local Council elections on the 4th May 2017.

The latest police update on local incidents had been circulated to all Members prior to the meeting. Adnan Ali, Community Speed Watch (CSW) Co-ordinator for both the West Mercia and Warwickshire Police had informed the Parish Council that following the enquiry from St. Martins in August 2015 via a member of the Safer Neighbourhood team (SNT) they are now in a position to offer CSW to St. Martins and the next step is for volunteers to be recruited.

The police have a criteria and a procedure in setting up CSW and St Martins has gone through this procedure successfully. The road of most concern identified is the Overton Road, between Stans Superstore and The Keys. This section of road is where we would look to set up a group. Other areas can be considered at a later date.

They require a minimum of six volunteers to form a group, one of which is nominated as group leader. There is no limit on the amount of members that a group can have. If the roads are suitable for Community Speed Watch then they carry out a risk assessment on

the roads and choose the locations where the volunteers will stand and conduct their activities. The Safer Roads Partnership provide all training and equipment to get the scheme going. Anyone wishing to be considered should contact the Parish Council Clerk on 01743 366420 or at <a href="mailto:clerk@stmartinsparishcouncil.gov.uk">clerk@stmartinsparishcouncil.gov.uk</a> for further details.

On highway matters, concern was expressed over the lack of road markings off Cottage Lane following the completion of the new development, a damaged road sign in Clerk's Lane plus fly tipping in this area and recent repairs to the road surface either side of Escob bridge, which were done to a poor standard, now breaking up again and being washed away.

The next meeting of the parish council will be a Full Council Meeting on Thursday 9th March 2017 at 7.00 pm in The Community Centre, St Martins.



#### She said:

"We now have 2 regular leaders and 2 section assistants at Beavers. They are all parents who are helping to make a massive difference to our group."

"The numbers of children more than doubled last year, I'm over the moon."

In fact there were so many new members, the Beavers began meeting at the earlier time of 5pm, with Cubs meeting later at 6:15pm to give everyone enough space at the hut.

Children were thrilled once again to be invited to the annual St Martins light switch-on, where they all enjoyed the gift of giving by bringing a donation for the Oswestry foodbank.

The children donated food urgently needed by the local charity including ketchup, sweetcorn and mashed potato.



# ST MARTINS COMMUNITY FIRST RESPONDERS

Another year has passed and John and I have gathered together all our statistics for 2016. You may be interested.

Between us we attended 829 jobs. 266 of those were in Oswestry, 138 in St Martins and 119 in Ellesmere.

147 were to falls, 92 to breathing problems, 76 to chest pains, and 63 to patients who were unwell in some form or another.

Our minimum on-call time has been 6 hours in a day. Mostly we have covered 17 hours per day (07.00 - 23.00) and there has not been a single day when neither of us was booked on at all.

We had 1 call out on Christmas Day and one on New Year's Day.

The car has done 7,526 miles on jobs this year (reimbursed by the ambulance service) and a further 1,320 miles moving between our homes and taking us to training and re-qualification courses (paid from our own funds donated by you, thank you).

As we head into 2017 I should remind you that you cannot contact CFRs directly. We are despatched by the ambulance service only after a 999 call has been made. We are then covered by WMAS insurance.

Please remember that a 999 call is for an Emergency, while a 111 call is for something Urgent that isn't necessarily an emergency. The Minor Injuries Unit in Oswestry is there for minor injuries and Shropdoc should be called if you need a doctor outside surgery hours.

The pharmacist in Stans gives free advice.

The tricky bit is deciding which one is the best one for you!


