

He was a successful player for the club and won many individual and team accolades in his time with us.



# Ifton Meadows Management Committee

As we write at the beginning of the year our thoughts are of new beginnings. On the second Sunday of the year we worked on the



hedge near the Colliery Entrance – the one at the end of the Horse Field that was inadvertently chopped down last year. We have planted a number of small saplings along the old hedge line. You won't notice them yet as they are only small beginnings, but when the Parish Council provides us with some larger specimens you will be able to see some new growth. Our aim is to provide a biodiverse wildlife corridor at the entrance to the reserve. Hazel, Bird Cherry and Wild Plum will eventually provide food for birds and small mammals while the branches will provide perching and nesting opportunities.

After our work at the Colliery Entrance we went over to Price's Dingle, thinking of the snowdrops that will soon begin to herald the start of another growing season. However, our work was not with the forthcoming snowdrops, but with the detritus of the

old year. We dug out silted up drains, removing large quantities of accumulated sand. This work will stop erosion and maintain good drainage across the pathway. We also cleared the rotting leaves off the boardwalk as they had reached the stage when they become slippery and potentially hazardous.

But to return to snowdrops - or galanthus nivalis to give it its botanical name. This part of the country is richly endowed with this charming plant. Its name galanthus is derived from two Greek words meaning milk flower, and it is also sometimes known as the website of hope. The Countryfile flower countryfile.com - gives nine things you might not know about snowdrops, including that the bulbs are poisonous if eaten. It also reminds us that under International Convention it is illegal to collect bulbs from the wild. Snowdrops are tending to appear earlier in the year than they used to and the spectacular display at Chirk Castle is expected in early February.

In our work on Ifton Meadows the small group of volunteers are only able to achieve a fraction of what could be done. If you visit and enjoy this beautiful site perhaps you could join us in the afternoon of the 2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday of each month to help maintain this valuable asset to the community.



We then went on to vote where we will go for our annual outing on August 1st. We decided on Gregynog is situated in the stunning Montgomeryshire Gregynog Hall Gardens. countryside and offers a mixture of Grade 1 listed formal gardens and woodland walks, which include a Lily lake, a Bee Apiary and stone statues. There is also a Courtyard Cafe and gift shop. So something for us all to look forward to come the Summer. Angela Ree asked us to come up with ideas for the Oswestry Show table top competition, the theme will be "On The Farm". Our speaker was Sue Lloyd from Erddig Hall and gave a slide show and very interesting talk of the history of the hall. We were then told the story of 32 year old Ellen Penketh a cook/housekeeper who came to Erddig in 1902 to work for the Squire Philip Yorke and his new wife Louisa Yorke. They gave lavish dinner parties and despite only ever having been a cook previously she was expected to run the whole household and was constantly told to keep costs down whilst they gave increasingly larger dinner parties. She was accused of stealing £500 from the accounts in 1907, a sum equivalent to £28,000 in today's money. She never had a penny to her name and no one could ever trace her having any money tucked away. We had to decide on the evidence if we thought she was guilty or innocent. It turned out she was acquitted at Ruthin Assizes, but was never able to work in a big house again. The whole thing backfired on the Yorke family as it came out in the newspapers they only paid her the salary of a cook and the other staff only half the going rate. What a sad but interesting tale. Shirley Willis gave the vote of thanks. Our next meeting will be on 7th February when Sue Dewhirst will talk about cardiac arrest in the young.
