# ST MARTINS COMMUNITY FIRST RESPONDERS AIR AMBULANCES

In the past year we have been fortunate enough to see the red helimeds in action several times. The one covering Shropshire is based at Cosford and the one

covering the Welsh border is based at Welshpool. Once mobilised, each will take just over 15 minutes to reach our area. They will both cross the border to where they are needed and we have welcomed both the Midlands and the Welsh (which has a big dragon on the side!) helicopters here in St Martins.

Shropshire Air Ambulance

They have a characteristic sound and I am always

very happy when I hear that distinctive clatter. The pilots, who are non-medics, can land on a sixpence leaving the health professionals to trot over fields and stiles carrying their kit to reach the patient. The crews don't say a lot but the way they work is astonishing, each knowing exactly what their task is yet combining as an efficient team. The equipment they have with them is second to none and they are able to manoeuvre



themselves and their patient around in the tiniest of spaces. Although the medics are NHS personnel the helicopters and the pilots are funded by charity alone and it costs thousands of pounds per outing, of course.

Even though the helicopter arrives at a job the patient won't necessarily be travelling in it - it has been sent because there is an emergency doctor on board who

can carry out rapid interventions which even our very best paramedics cannot. Once stabilised the patient may be transported by land ambulance while the helicopter and its crew fly off to the next job. Now that beats being bumped in a cart to the quack in the next village as our forefathers were!

As the game is designed to centre around user generated content, some inappropriate content may be shared with the community.


It also has social elements built into it that allow both public and private chats. This has created some reported instances of this app being used by some adults to make inappropriate contact with children.


# The Three Parishes Community Wildlife Group

## Shropshire Wheels2Work - Helping Three Parishes Residents Stay in Work

A Three Parishes resident has been able to stay in work, thanks to a transport loan through Shropshire Rural Communities Charity's Wheels2Work scheme.

Kyle, from Gobowen, had lift shared from Gobowen to work in Welshpool but when his driver-colleague left his job, Kyle was going to lose his means of getting to work. He contacted Wheels2Work who were able to loan him a 125cc Scooter.

Kyle says of the scheme, "it has personally helped me a lot. Without it I would have lost my job".

Wheels2Work can loan at a low, subsidised rate, 50cc Mopeds, 125cc Scooters, electric bikes and bicycles to eligible clients who have either an existing job or a firm job offer.

The Wheels2Work scheme is available across Shropshire but thanks to localised funding through the Three Parishes Big Local Project, the charity is able to focus on delivering its services to residents of to people who work in the Three Parishes area (Gobowen, Weston Rhyn and St Martins).







- 4 Dogs must be kept under control at ALL times. Wrexham Borough Council brought in the following Dog Control Legislation on 1st March 2017. I quote:

: Any person in charge of a dog in a public place must ensure their dog is on a lead at All times.

: If a dog fouls anywhere in a public place the faeces must be removed and disposed of appropriately.

: A person committing an offence will have 14 days to pay a fixed penalty of £100 (or £75 if paid within 7 days), failing which they may be prosecuted.

If you do not want to see this legislation brought in on the Meadows and North Shropshire make sure that you clean up after your dog and if you see someone not cleaning up remind them that they are putting the future of all dogs to run free on the Meadows in jeopardy.

At our meeting held on 7th February we sang Jerusalem and The National Anthem to commemorate the Queens 65 year Jubilee of her ascension to the throne, a unique achievement! Our speaker was Sue Dewhirst who spoke about Cardiac Risk in the Young. The charity is called CRY. The condition is also known as Young Sudden Cardiac Arrest or YSCD. She got involved because her 17 yr old

son died of this condition as he took part in a fitness session at his college. She has since learnt a great deal about the condition and speaks and supports many events that raise funds for the charity. They raise awareness and provide subsidised testing for 14 - 35 yr olds. Testing cannot be done at younger ages since the heart has not stopped growing and can give false readings. A great many of us had not realised the statistics - every week in the U.K. 12 apparently fit and healthy young people under 35 die from undiagnosed cardiac conditions. She was one very brave and inspirational lady and we learnt such a lot from her talk that evening. I urge anyone with 14 to 35 yr olds in their family to consider having them tested through this charity.

We have had invitations to several outings including one from our Oswestry North Group for a coach trip to Well Dressing at Tissington in Derbyshire on 26th May 2017. We also discussed our own outing on 1st August to Gregynog Hall Gardens.



Our meeting on March 7th took place at Upstairs Downstairs Cookery shop in Oswestry. We attended an Italian Cookery Workshop run by the owner Yossi Gliksman. We were made very welcome and soon settled down to a really lovely treat. Yossi started with a Focaccia Bread with red onion and rosemary sprinkled on the top. He kept up a very lively conversation showing the different methods of kneading the dough and why he used that particular method. We also learned the correct way to maintain and sharpen, and also to hold our kitchen knives and which chopping boards were the best. Also the different metals used for cookware and how they differed in heat conduction. After that he went on to make a Risotto with parmesan cheese. The whole time giving us tips on ingredients and utensils. He then prepared a salad with fresh mozzarella slices, tomato and basil. This was complemented with a balsamic vinegar reduction dressing drizzled over the top. You can imagine the wonderful smells emanating from all of this - our taste buds were getting going. Then the big moment came when we got to sample everything, delicious! Yossi was thanked by our President Shirley Willis.

Next months meeting will be held on 4th April at The Miners Institute at 7.30 p.m. and we will be having our Spring Show. We will also be having as our speaker Gillian Sturgess - cake decorating. Visitors and new members are always welcome.


