This is not an onerous task as it simply consists of sending out agendas and calling notices for committee meetings once every two months, taking the notes of those meetings and ensuring that invoices are sent out to our advertisers.

We also still need someone to take on the delivery of future issues to the 62 homes in Greenfields. It is being covered temporarily, but really needs someone living locally to take it on please.

From the Chair

As the new Chair of St Martins Parish Council, may I say on behalf of our Councillors and those villagers who have benefited from Sue Schofield's leadership, many thanks Sue for your hard work in leading St Martins Parish Council for almost 3 years.

At this year's Annual Meeting of the Parish Council, I was elected as Chairman, and Andrew Cast was elected as Vice Chairman. Otherwise there is no other change.

We did not have a contested election therefore the same councillors continue to serve our community - and that is what we seek to do.

The Good Councillor' Guide (p9) tells us that some of the issues that concern parish government are these: "community safety, housing, street lighting, allotments, cemeteries, playing fields, community centres, litter, war memorials, seats and shelters, rights-of-way, and some aspects of planning and highways..." If you read the Minutes of our Parish Council meetings you will know that we discuss such issues and make collective decisions on them that we consider are in the best interest of our village and community. We are unpaid volunteers who have a heart for the well-being of our village and we abide by a rigorous code of conduct that ensures impartiality in our decisions.

The Government allows us to spend some money raised locally. Parish Councils are empowered to raise a precept or local tax which is collected by Shropshire Council as part of the overall Council Tax. As Sue said in the last Village Life magazine, for this year we were able to hold our precept at the same level as last year. That is due to good book-keeping by our Parish Clerk and our Councillor Chair of Finance. We thank them for their hours of labour.

As Chair, I will comment on village developments in future issues of the Village Life, but for more detail, please read our published Minutes (available on the Parish Council website), and in the Village Life please read the article by our Parish Clerk, Edward Davies, keeping you informed of issues discussed in our Parish Council meetings.

Report from St Martins Parish Council Clerk

The local elections on 4th May saw all existing Cllrs re-elected unopposed. At the Annual Meeting of St Martins Parish Council Cllr Glenn Pennington was elected as Chairman, with Cllr Andrew Cast being appointed as Vice Chairman. Cllr G. Pennington then thanked Cllrs for electing him to this position and thanked Cllr S. Schofield for her past two and a half years as Chairman and raising the standards of this position and the operation of the Council. Members of the Parish Council were also appointed to a number of committees which include Executive, Recreation Services, Finance, Planning and Street Lighting.

At the monthly Council meeting CSO Pete Roberts went through the crime figures for our parish for April. Cllrs requested figures from recent speed checks in the village. A number of Cllrs expressed concern over the new traffic management scheme for the A5 Gledrid junction and questioned why bollards are left overnight restricting traffic movement when no works were taking place. These concerns would be passed on to Highways England. Cllrs also suggested the police monitor the traffic flow in this area once this work has been completed. Although we now have six volunteers for the community speed watch scheme it was agreed that we still need more people to come forward for training. Please contact the Parish Clerk if you are interested in volunteering.

The Parish Council saw no reason to object to the planning application for the erection of a two storey extension and associated alterations at Pentre Farm, Pentre, St Martins, although concern was expressed over how this property will now be significantly enlarged by this extension. An application for outline planning permission for residential development of 2 dwellings on land adjoining Smithy Cottage, Overton Road, St Martins was also considered. The Parish Council saw no reason to object to this application but felt that two properties would be an over development of the site and expressed serious concerns over the safety of access in and out of the site whichever access was agreed.

Shropshire Cllr Steve Davenport said he would shortly be having a meeting with Shropshire Council officers to consider the issues raised by members of the public at the last meeting concerning a number of our narrow lanes which were not being maintained by Shropshire Council. Some which were previously maintained with tarmac surfaces are now just muddy tracks and cannot be used by cars or bikes and in places are difficult for walkers. Others have roadside drains blocked.

Some Cllrs felt a proposal to remove the mini island at the junction of Ellesmere and Overton Roads would help improve traffic issues in this area, but widening the road would make it worse. It was felt that a complete review of traffic management in the village was urgently required.

Cllrs reported the footpath behind the Institute in Green Lane was now impossible to walk along in certain places. A damaged road sign in Clarkes Lane had still not been replaced, a number of quad bikes had been reported in the area, a drain cover lifted out onto the road and an increase of litter along this lane. Concern was also raised about the state of the field on the right hand side as you enter St Martins from the Gledrid direction. The ditch opposite Orchard Close has still not been dug out, road markings have still not been replaced at the end of Cottage Lane and lines in Coopers Lane and Mount Bradford Lane still require re-painting. These items will be reported to Shropshire Council Highways Dept. along with a request for a sign for Moors Lane Chapel to be erected on the main road.

Nip Garden Crime 'in the bud'

It's that time of year when a lot of you will be working hard in your gardens keeping the weeds down and the grass tidy. Please remember to make sure your garden tools, especially power tools, are all locked away when not in use. Sheds should all have sturdy padlocks but also hasps, as they are often cut rather than the padlock. Also

remember that if they are held on with screws, that they can easily and quickly be undone with a cordless screwdriver. Most DIY stores stock 'tamper proof' screws that can't be undone, these are a brilliant preventative measure. Fit grilles or meshes to windows and invest in an inexpensive shed alarm.

'Defensive Planting' is the use of prickly shrubs in vulnerable areas such as windows, fences, boundary walls and drain pipes. It can also make it difficult for people to climb though

into your garden if they are around the boundary.

Putting a trellis on top of fencing also makes it difficult for people to climb over.
