We've recently been informed of some potential safeguarding risks with the app *Roblox*. *Roblox* is a game available for Xbox One, Playstation 4, Windows 10, Apple Mac, iPhone, iPad, Android and Amazon Fire devices. It allows users to create user generated games and share them with their friends in a virtual massively multiplayer world.

As the game is designed to centre around user generated content, some inappropriate content may be shared with the community.

It also has social elements built into that allow both public and private chats. This has created some reported instances of this app being used by some adults to make inappropriate contact with children.




Why not grow a Sunflower this year?

Oswestry Round Challenge (ORC)

Saturday 10th June 2017

The Oswestry Round Challenge (ORC) is now in its second year. It is a 33-mile walk combining parts of Offa's Dyke Path and the Montgomery and Llangollen Canals to form a complete circuit around Oswestry, starting and finishing at the Lion Quays Hotel and Spa complex on the A5 just to the north of the town.

Last year the ORC raised over £16,000 for Cancer Research UK and Lingen Davies Cancer Fund at the Royal Shrewsbury Hospital. The aim this year is to raise £25,000. The Challenge is based on a book by Dave Andrews and his wife Jane Trudgill. Dave was treated in the Lingen Davies Centre in 2014 and sees both the book he wrote and the annual Challenge as ways of saying thank you for the care he received. 'I wanted to put something back in as the staff at the Lingen Davies Centre were absolutely marvellous - always kind, helpful and compassionate.'



'Jane and I are delighted that the book, which we published with help

from Borderland Rotary Club and the Lion Quays and others, has raised over £3,500 on its own. Last year's Challenge was a tremendous success and we've now raised nearly £20,000. We're very proud, naturally. I'm now working on a new book to raise more money for these two excellent cancer charities. It will be called 'Gobowen to Everest' and it's based on a diary I kept on a trek to Everest Base Camp.' This year's Challenge will be held on Saturday 10 June. Those who take part will be able to attempt either the whole route - all 33 miles! - or just half of it and stop at Llanymynech and get a lift back to the start. Ifton Meadows Management Committee

The weather over the first few months of the year has meant that we have not been able

to do much work on the Meadows but April saw us out planting 8 specimen trees, 4 Malus sylvestris (Crab apple) and 4 Prunus padus (Bird Cherry). St.Martins Parish Council paid for 6 of the trees along with fertilizer, stakes, compost and tree guards and the other 2 we paid for out of our own funds.

Some time ago the Parish Council asked if we could find a place for 6 trees to plant in lieu of the two mature trees that had to be cut down within the village. We were happy to do this provided that we could choose the type of trees. As the site is a designated Local Nature Reserve we can only plant native trees. Crab Apple and Bird Cherry where chosen to provide food for birds and bees. The day was dry and hot but thankfully we had a cool breeze which helped. The trees



have been planted along the line of the old hedge and should provide lots of colour in the coming years as well as attracting bees and providing food for birds. It was also time to give our new hi-viz jackets with 'Meadows Volunteer' on the back an airing.



Over the winter we have been planning some new information boards for the Meadows. We have consulted with a designer and aim to provide one board with a map and some information about the flora and fauna and another on the history of the site and Ifton Colliery. We have been accepted for a grant from Tesco's "Bags for Help" scheme, so if you or anyone you know shop at Tesco's in Ellesmere any time over the next two months, the more tokens that go in the Ifton Meadows box the

more money we are likely to get towards our new boards.

Meanwhile, keep enjoying the Meadows and watch for the early summer flowers. Bees and butterflies should be well in evidence too.





Dyffryn Ceiriog Male Voice Choir


