Parish Council

What is a Parish Plan? Simply put, it is a community-led plan. Village residents volunteer to canvass other residents as to how their community can be changed for the better. A document is formed that sets out a vision for the future of the parish of St Martins and outlines how that can achieved in an action plan. Canvassing can take different forms, such as household questionnaires, interactive workshops, or mobile displays, to stimulate inquiry and response. When completed, the final document is forwarded to Shropshire Council for their perusal and notice. The hope is that the Unitary Authority will take note of the concerns and wishes of villagers in the Parish Plan. When used in conjunction with the Place Plan (a Parish Council-led document) both can be a persuasive force, particularly in the province of planning.


Two local volunteers, Helen Williams and Shirley Willis, will be leading the research and asking the questions. It is hoped that you can help them. Tell them what you think the village needs.

Report from St Martins Parish Council Clerk

The September meeting of the Parish Council which was held in the Community Centre, St Martins, featured a detailed presentation from the West Mercia Police and Crime Commissioner John Campion. John reported that since his election in May 2016 he had been working on the Safer West Mercia Plan 2016-2021. He added that taking a good service and making it great represents a big challenge. This challenge means giving his officers the tools, skills and processes to do their work more effectively and more efficiently.

All officers are now being kitted out with radio recorder cameras, iPhones and iPads which result in less paperwork at the station but which improve relationships with local communities by improving engagement, visibility and accessibility. For our communities, it will mean empowering people to play a more active role in identifying and addressing local issues. One such area is speeding. Through the Community Speed Watch Scheme, reported in the last issue of the Village Life, where we still require more volunteers. As regards questions raised by ClIrs and members of the public he added that there were grants for crime reduction,. Speed limit enforcement was always on the police agenda, but changes to these limits were the responsibility of Shropshire Council. He also agreed to look at the way monthly crime reports are compiled and issued to the Parish Council.

As there had been no meeting in August, a large than usual number of planning applications were considered. Most of these were supported by the Parish Council. However the Parish Council had concerns on some.

On the proposed residential development on land West of Smithy Cottage, Overton Road, the Parish Council felt that this type of development is not an appropriate place for a house and not in keeping with area, but would prefer a bungalow type dwelling.

With regards to conversion of farm outbuildings to form three residential properties and covered parking to include some demolition and rebuilding of one single storey extension at barns at Fach Farm House, Fach Lane, the Parish Council supports this application but believes that it should be subject to a condition being placed on this application that these three units are for agricultural use only.

On the erection of two storey side extension at number 15 Garden Village, the Parish Council were concerned that this two storey extension appeared to leave no through access to the rear of the property.

The next meeting of the Parish Council will be held on Thursday 12th October 2017 starting at 7.00 pm in The Moors Community Centre, Moors Lane.

Village issues are still progressing well. We are moving forward with plans on the former Ifton Heath School site, where we are looking to retain the old school building itself for use as small business units. In the rest of the grounds we want to create a mixture of some bungalows, together with possibly some assisted living housing for older people, giving a mixed use development to benefit the village as a whole.

At the last Parish Council meeting we welcomed the Police and Crime Commissioner, John Champion, who was questioned by Councillors, on a range of local policing issues, including the increase in traffic speeding in and through St Martins. To try and reduce this problem, I am continuing press for the installation of flashing 30mph warning signs in the village - and there will soon be in place a group of local volunteers who will be monitoring vehicle speeds with the help of the Police and the Safer Roads Partnership.

In my work as chairman of the St Martins Centre Trustees I am, with the other Trustees, considering leasing out the Arthan's fishing pond. If there are any parties interested in discussing this, please contact either myself or Sue Heard, the Treasurer, at the Centre.

My Shropshire Council Cabinet role on Highways and Transport means I have to spend more time in Shrewsbury than I would like, but I am still available to discuss local issues. So if there is anything you would like to talk to or see me about please don't hesitate to contact me. Three Parishes Community Wildlife Group

The newly formed wildlife group has got off to a good start having the first meeting in January. All the meetings have been well attended and it was agreed that we would meet in each of the three parishes in rotation. Talks have been varied on subjects such as Wild flowers, Mason bees, garden birdwatching, the ecology of the Llangollen canal

to name just some of them.

One talk was by Leo Smith a very knowledgeable ornithologist on the decline of the Lapwing and Curlews over the last few years. As a result of this talk over 20 members agreed to do surveys in the three parishes to try to ascertain the numbers in the area. Several of us attended a training session with Leo. There were mixed results from the surveys but with the help of a local landowner we were able to record a good sized colony of Lapwings within the parish. It is hoped that the survey work will continue. The surveyors do three surveys over a three month period and obviously keep to rights of



way and public highways so it is possible that we could miss sightings of the birds. We would welcome information from anyone who has knowledge of either lapwings or curlews being seen to contact the chairman Polly Smith, contact details below.

On the 19th October we meet at the Pavilion in Gobowen for a talk by John Lightfoot on Barn owl conservation. final meeting for the year is in November when one of our members will give an illustrated talk on the Wildlife to be found in our area. The programme for next year is being compiled and will be available soon. The group is based in the parishes of Wes-Rhyn, Martins, Selattyn St Gobowen but anyone who has an interest in wildlife is invited to attend any of our meetings.



The aims and objectives of a Community Wildlife Group include:

- Bring together people interested in wildlife
- Undertake survey work to establish the status of key bird, plant and butterfly species and habitats.
- Encourage and enhance local interest in wildlife
- Actively promote conservation
