Hello my name is Moira Gleed and I am the Dystonia Society's volunteer co-ordinator for the North Wales and Shropshire Borders branch. I arrange meetings several times a year, both at St. Martins


Centre and at Craig y Don Sports Centre in Llandudno, where people with this rare neurological movement disorder and their families and friends meet, sometimes with a speaker but mainly to support each other. There are 15 different types ranging from generalised (whole body) to focal (affecting one or more areas). It is estimated that it affects at least 70,000 people in the UK.

For those of you who have not heard of our condition I will try to explain a little about it. Dystonia is the term used to describe uncontrollable and sometimes painful muscle spasms caused by incorrect signals thought to come from the part of the brain called the basal ganglia. It can be inherited, or you can acquire it, i.e. no known cause. This also occurs with other conditions, for example Cerebral Palsy.

These faulty signals cause muscles to spasm and pull on the body incorrectly. This forces the body into twisting, repetitive movements or abnormal postures which can be permanent or sporadic. There is as yet no cure but by combining treatment with pain control and sensory tricks to help with social situations - most people manage to develop successful strategies for living. Remission from symptoms does sometimes occur but is rare.

Ifton Meadows **Management Committee**

You will have noticed that Shropshire Council have been doing their annual cut on Ifton Meadows. The removal of the ragwort has been a great help to the friends this year, we usually spend many workdays

pulling/digging out the ragwort and as we get older the amount we can remove gets less, so although the area near the mosaic looks shorn it will soon recover and hopefully in the future we will have less of it on site. We do not want to remove it all because it is the main food of the Cinnabar Moth and we are a Local Nature Reserve. This year we have seen a number of Cinnabar Moth caterpillars - known by local children as 'Tigger tails' which is a good sign - numbers of Cinnabar Moths on site have declined over the years, possibly because we have been removing the plants. Shropshire Council have received complaints from neighbouring landowners about ragwort and as it is a notifiable plant they have to


remove it.



Change

In the last issue of 'Village Life' I wrote about how change had affected the lives of two ex-miners, Terry Ellis and Ken Hinton. I suppose any generation will be aware of the discomfort and the stimulation that change can bring. 'Why can't things just remain the same?' 'It wasn't like that in my day.' 'It's nice to do something new.' The discomfort and the sense of anticipation come at each stage of change: before, when it's awaited, during, while it's happening, and afterwards, when we have to live with consequences. In the four and a half years that I have lived in St. Martin's I have seen and felt change in my own life and in the life of the village, the most visible being the building of new housing. From where I live I have heard the sounds of construction coming across the More houses, more people, a changed fields and watched new houses appear. environment for the established and a new, exciting one for the newcomer. What these two groups of people have in common is the current experience of the impact of change on their lives, some greeting it eagerly, others more resistant. Change means loss, for the most part, of the familiar. Change makes demands, to adjust to the new, to mourn the loss of the old, to re-make, re-group, hopefully accept, even embrace the new, maybe with generosity and signs of welcome.

Any community has a history, an evolutionary trace, identifiable in St. Martin's by means of three examples among others. Ifton Colliery came and went over fifty-plus years and its closure will be commemorated next year. Stan's Supermarket, a striking example of how a business can evolve, is celebrating its 70th anniversary now. St. Martin's Parish Church, whose name it gave to the village, is changed and unchanged, 400 year-old bells still pealing, meeting challenges, new and old, daily and eternally. More change awaits in the housing development to come on Rhos-y-Llan Farm.

But....the more things change the more they remain the same. One can read the ancients, Greek and Roman, and hear the old bemoaning the behaviour and attitudes of the young. Mark Twain remarked on how inept and foolish his father was when Mark was fourteen, and how wise he had become when he reached twenty-one. The old have the benefit of hindsight and diminished energy. The young have abundant energy and very slowly developing hindsight. We are human! Also, we are a community and maybe something gets into a community's DNA from how it has evolved. I am conscious that in this respect there is more than a lingering legacy of St. Martin's as a mining community. I walk around the village and people smile and say 'Hello' and

'Good morning' and probably mention the weather. Change has not, in my experience, stopped that sort of thing. Mums, and Dads, take their children to and from school. Pubs are still places of conviviality. Pensioners meet in Stan's cafe. This journal gives an account of variety and activity among us all. There are constants and there are new challenges. It really would be nice if we could *settle*. On the other hand we do need a bit of a shake-up from time to time. I guess it's all about being alive. *Don Borland*

School Saver Clubs

Over the last year pupils at Gobowen and Weston Rhyn Primary Schools have been

saving through an exciting project, funded by Three Parishes Big Local. The School Saver Club project helps pupils learn how to save and manage money. Supported by FAIRshare Credit Union, year 6 pupils at each school have been running weekly School Saver Clubs; open to all children attending the school. Membership is free, and children can deposit as little or as much as they wish.

The schools and pupils have worked extremely hard at the savings clubs and between the 2 schools they have saved an incredible £6,216.07.

We are currently working with St Martins School and are hopeful they will launch their own School Saver Club very soon.

My Money Matters
