Report from St Martins Parish Council Clerk

The November meeting of the Parish Council which was held in St Martins Centre.

The Police have looked into the collision involving the bus shelter on Overton Road opposite St Martins Centre. The Police were informed of damage to the bus shelter by a passing motorist at 00:25 hours on 7th October. It would appear a vehicle had been in collision with it and then made off. No-one has reported to the Police that they were the driver. The police have made enquiries with Stan's Superstore and the Miners Institute in relation to their CCTV, unfortunately both cameras had not picked up anything. The Parish Council have now applied through their insurance company (and had approval) for a new replacement bus shelter.

On the subject of CCTV, following a presentation by one of the Centres Trustees at the October meeting on their project to 'Keep Everyone Safe' in the centre and surrounding area, the Parish Council have agreed to fund the CCTV part of this project. This included updating the CCTV with 14 cameras to ensure full coverage of all areas around the building and to cover the field behind Stan's. The Parish Council and the Centre Trustees will continue to liaise through their joint contracts review group to ensure the ongoing effectiveness of camera locations generally and future improvements specifically, while the Centre will be responsible for the costs of annual maintenance, repair, and insurance of the installed CCTV system.

The Parish Council now has six volunteers for the Community Speed Watch scheme. Training will commence once the police can set this up.

Councillors will be considering any amendments to our part of the Oswestry area Place Plan before our December meeting along with any comments on the second stage of consultation on the Shropshire Council Local Plan Review, the 'Preferred Scale and Distribution of Development'. Both consultations end on the 22nd December 2017.

On planning only one application was considered which was for prior notification under Schedule 2 Part 11 of the Town & Country Planning (General Permitted Development) Order 2015 for the demolition of existing units at Bank Top Industrial Estate, St Martins, Shropshire. The Parish Council supported this application.

As regards Street Naming & Numbering for any new developments, Shropshire Council had proposed the street name 'Green Lane' for the new development on land east of 8A, Moors Lane. With a Green Lane already in the village, and to eliminate any postal address confusion, the Parish Council proposed that this street should be called 'Lilac Lane'.

Although the Parish Council continues to monitor the development along Overton Road, following intervention from Shropshire Council Highways, the developers have removed the undergrowth that was protruding over the footpath. The Parish Council had no further updates from Shropshire Council on improving the yellow lines outside the school and plans to improve the mini island at the junction of Overton Road and Ellesmere Road.

The next meeting of the Parish Council will be held on Thursday 14th December 2017 starting at 7.00 pm in St Martins Centre.





There have been some wonderful donations given, not least a £500 donation from Chirk Town Council, presented to Terry Ellis by the Chairman Mr Frank Hemmings, and another £500 from Mr Hefin Looker, the last manager of Ifton Colliery. He is 93 now and still remembers clearly the pit. We hope he will be able to attend and help to unveil the statue of 'The Miner of the 60's' on Saturday 24th November 2018.

The James Lambert Singers' concert on the 13th October was a fabulous evening, such a relaxed and smooth form of entertainment. Our grateful thanks to Stan's Superstore for agreeing to have the Commemorative Medals on sale in their store. You will find the cabinet by the entrance to the Coffee Shop. We now have just over £15,000 in the kitty so far. In conjunction with the Foundry the process of scaling-up from the clay Marquette to the full scale of 7' 6" statue is about to begin.

We are hoping to sound it at the unveiling. If you have a full licence and a car that can comfortably fit two or three passengers, have a couple of hours spare once a month on the third Sunday of the month, and would like to get involved in helping those who live alone to get out to socialise with people like themselves, then we very definitely would love to hear from you.

The ladies of the group are all lovely and they'll leave you in no doubt as to how grateful they are to you for giving of your time. Those who host the teas in their homes are kind and generous one and all, and those couple of hours on a Sunday once a month give all of the group something to enjoy and something to look forward to.

"The time I feel most lonely is after six o'clock at night but when I have been out to a Contact tea then I don't feel lonely at all, just fresh memories of a lovely afternoon out with friends" - Pearl, 89 (Contact the Elderly member, from CTE literature).
