felt very strongly about bringing Football Back To The Village.







Stans Superstore Celebrates 70th Anniversary

After returning from a Japanese Prisoner of War Camp in 1947 Stan Faulks, with the help of wife Vera and sister Gert, took his first step in retailing in St Martins. Firstly operating a Fish and Chip shop and latterly a convenience store.

Working many a long hour they built their business whilst developing a tremendous rapport with the mining community of St Martins. A long term mutual respect was created with the villagers supporting Stan and Vera and they in turn did whatever they could to help the local community.

Stan and Vera had two Children, firstly Peter in 1951 and Rob in 1952. The lads showed interest in the business from a very early age. They both grew up learning from their



Dad but Stan knew that if the shop was to develop in the future he needed his sons to experience retailing away from the family shop. Peter learned the trade as a Manager with Tesco and Robert as Assistant Manager with Woolworths. They both then returned to the business with ideas for developing it.



Many alterations and extensions progressed over the years until 1991 when the largest development of the site was made transforming the store to a 23,500sqft Superstore.

Stans Shop had joined Nisa in 1981 which was a mutual grocery supply operation which benefitted all the members with a better combined buying power. This enabled Stans to be as competitive as other Supermarkets. This has remained in force until today. Now with Peter's children, Andrew and Sarah, and Rob's, Lisa and Kate, also involved in the business the future is bright. The business has

expanded to other areas with the next generation keen to develop other opportunities.

The recent announcement that The Cooperative, who have a wholesaling division, will be taking over Nisa has further secured a great future in Independent retailing for the family. This will enable Stans to operate exactly as it always has but with the added benefit of a Larger Chill and Fresh range. We now, after 70 years, look forward to continuing to provide St Martins and the surrounding areas with great products, prices and service for many years to come

It must be mentioned that nothing has been taken for granted over the years and it is only thanks to our wonderful staff and terrific customers that we have remained strong. We all look forward to a great future together and would like to say a big **THANKYOU** for the first **70**

We have managed to attend workdays most months - work ranged from keeping open waterways at the pond, along with clearing the pathways and the Brownies Meadow.

Recently we concentrated our work around the Colliery entrance, cutting back the hedge on the right hand side - right back to the hidden kerb and clearing the tarmac on the main pathway. This job is ongoing.

We planted 12 large saplings in the Spring, 6 from the Parish Council which replaced three trees cut down in the village plus six we purchased, including Bird Cherry and Crab Apple - to which we had to carry water over the following weeks. They are looking good and hopefully next year we will see some blossom.



On Sunday we also found one of the picnic tables destroyed either by vandals or possibly a theft that had gone wrong - the other table had also been damaged this time they tried prising the nails out.

On the plus side 20 Tesco workers came on the 19th September to help clear saplings from the left hand side of the main pathway to the mosaic.

On Monday Bryan, Neil and I met Mike from MA Creative to give him a guided walk around the site -

before he starts on the three interpretation boards we have ordered.



Our 'Friends of Ifton Meadows' page is going from strength to strength and many are putting photographs on, it is just a pity they are not interested in being hands on.

We also, this year, managed a trip to Hunkington Nurseries, Walford where we enjoyed a

talk by Viv Marsh on the 'Mason Bee' and how Shropshire is at the forefront in surveying their numbers.

We again must thank Pentre Nurseries and their customers for a £55 donation from the sale of second-hand books and Pant WI for their £20 donation for a guided walk around the site in August.





- 1. N/S play as a team against the E/W pair. You are player S. W starts by choosing a card from his own hand (He decides on ♠5)
- 2. N puts his cards face up on the table so everyone can see them. Each trick is won by the pair playing the highest card in the suit led, so the first trick will be won by whoever plays highest ♠. That person then starts the next trick, choosing any card from their hand.
- 3. The order of play is clockwise and you play N's and S's hands throughout the game. Everyone must follow suit if they can*, but they can choose which card in the suit to play. (e.g. You decide to play ♠3 from N's hand rather than the ♠9).
- 4. E now plays the ♠Q from their hand, so it's S's turn. You could win the trick with ♠K by overtaking E's ♠Q, or play a low ♠. You decide to win with the ♠K. Now see if you can win another 8 tricks!

Other rules: (i) *Anyone unable to follow suit can play

any of their remaining cards. (ii) Everyone plays as well as they can: E/W won't throw away good cards to make it easy. (If you get stuck, turn the page upside down!) This is a bridge hand but you don't need any knowledge of bridge to solve it. Phone Nat (01691 830376) for details of bridge lessons or visit the Oswestry Bridge Club website.

♠K wins your first trick. Other winners are ♦AKQ, ♥AK, and ♣AK, total 8 tricks. But with \P A still out, your rather exposed ♠1 makes the ninth looks elusive. **Solution:** make sure the first time you lose a trick it is only won by W, not by E. So, win the second trick by playing ♠2 (S) to the ♠A (N). Then begin the third trick by playing a low club back from N, e.g. ♠4. If E puts to the ♠A on it, cover with ♠K, otherwise play the ♣1. If instead W has ♠Q and therefore beats your ♣1, don't worry. You have $oldsymbol{ull}$ the remaining winning clubs and W will not be able to capture your ♣1 in the meantime. The technique of playing a lower card (e.g. ♣1 rather than the meantime. The meantime of playing a lower card (e.g. ♣1 rather than capture your ♠1) hoping to catch out one in the middle (♠Q) is called a finesse. (Quiz by Mike Ingle)
