Parish Council

From the Chair

You may sometimes ask, "What does the Parish Council do?"

Well, we get involved in many different aspects of village life. In the past year we have awarded a contract to a local person to pick litter from various fields; to clean our bus shelters; to maintain our Memorial garden; and to do general maintenance as required and notified through the Parish Clerk.

At our monthly meetings we comment on planning applications affecting the village.

We recently encouraged six local residents to train to be members of St Martins Community Speed Watch – to monitor speeding traffic along Overton and Ellesmere Roads. So speeding motorists *prenez-garde* (take care).

John Campion, Police and Crime Commissioner for West Mercia, attended one of our Parish Council meetings, as did Peter Nutting, Leader of Shropshire Council. Both gentlemen gave your Council and members of the Public a good account of their various areas of responsibility and what impact there may be on our community.

The bus shelter by the Institute that someone tried to take for a ride was replaced on Council Insurance and this new see-through shelter now gives better visibility to those cars about to egress on to Overton Road.

Andrew Cast, our Vice-Chair, has been canvassing villagers asking you what sports and other facilities you want on the new Brynkinalt Recreation Site - which could possibly be operational in 2019. Your Council is taking the lead in negotiations with lain Hill-Trevor (who is donating the land to the Parish Council), St Martins All-Through School, and the St Martins Football Club. All concerned parties are enthusiastic that the wider community have access to the new facilities, not just those who have an immediate interest.

We have updated our Local Plan; and we are negotiating with Shropshire Council about taking on the freehold of some village grassed areas because we think we can do a better (and more cost-effective) job of grounds' maintenance than Shropshire Council's *Ringway* or its replacement contractor later this year.

Stop press. The property development at Orchard Close provided us with CiL (Community Infrastructure Levy) funds, some of which we used to buy the CCTV system now operating in your Village Centre. Currently, there are 15 cameras and channels in use, and these cameras provide coverage that ranges from over the dugouts on the playing field behind Stan's, to all around and inside the Centre. The colour video is absolutely clear, even at night, and already has ably assisted the Police in some of their enquiries.

Lastly, we have one vacancy for a Parish Councillor. If you think you can contribute to the well-being of our community, please let the Clerk, or myself, or any Councillor

know your willingness to serve on our team. Like us, you will find that it is rewarding for all when one sees a plan come together.

Enjoy your New Year all the year.

Report from St Martins Parish Council Clerk

The January meeting of the Parish Council which was held in St Martins Centre. The Chairman welcomed Councillor Peter Nutting, Leader of Shropshire Council, to the meeting.

Peter explained that his main plans during the coming months would be focussed on economic development, adult social care and the culture of the council staff. He then explained in some detail the financial problems the council are facing, which has led to proposals for an increase in council tax this year of 5.99%. Councillors expressed concern that Shropshire Council were capital rich and revenue poor and questioned why it had taken them so long to recognise this. Peter went on to explain that plans are being considered for redeveloping the Riverside Shopping centre in Shrewsbury and turning some of their assets, especially in the Market towns, into multi-purpose units. Other concerns were the budget for social care and the £18m proposed expenditure to update the Shirehall. Peter was asked to look into plans for youth provision across the County which seems to be concentrated on Market Towns and not the rural areas, and at the road gritting policy which currently excluded new estate roads with mainly elderly residents. The Chairman thanked Peter for attending the meeting.

Concern was expressed that following the recent litter pick in the football field to the rear of Stans Superstore 35 bags of dog mess had been left on top of and around the dugout This is clearly unacceptable and we were hoping that with the new CCTV coverage of the area the dog owner(s) responsible will be able to be identified and some action taken. We have already mentioned it to a Trustee at the Centre who has discussed it with the CCTV installer and he has advised how the CCTV can be set in order to make it easier to discover the culprit. Agreed to look into the powers the local authority has in respect of this and what further action can be taken.

The street name plates for Ifton View have been collected from the highways depot at Whittington and passed to our handyman to be repaired and put back.

Shropshire Council are still looking at installing double yellow lines outside the school

and no plans are yet forthcoming on any changes to the design of the mini island at the junction of Overton Road and Ellesmere Road.

When faults are reported on street lights that belong to the Parish Council, these are passed to Highline Electrical and usually repaired within a week. This is not the case with lights that belong to Shropshire Council, who have advised that repairs are taking anything up to six weeks to repair due to lack of staff. Five faulty street lights owned by Shropshire Council opposite the school have been reported and an urgent request placed to have these repaired quickly due to the fact that the start and finish of the school day is still in darkness and because Councillors are concerned over the speed of traffic in this area with many vehicles still failing to go round the mini island.

These concerns have been passed on to the police.

We have now got to the stage of drawing initial plans for the old Ifton Heath Primary School site where we hope to persuade Shropshire Council to support a mixed use development with housing, including some much needed assisted living properties, while retaining the main school building. That we believe would provide excellent office space for small incubator business use.

You probably know that the Parish Council and myself are holding discussions with the Brynkinalt estate on the provision of a sports facility for the Village which will be superb addition for everyone.

I'm also concerned about the quality of the roundabout junction at Overton Road, Green Lane and Ellesmere Road. I've recently had officers from Shropshire Council on site looking at the problem with a view to upgrading both the road and the junction.

I would like to welcome Helen Williams back to the Parish Council (filling one of the two vacancies there). I also wish speedy recoveries to Councillors Sue Schofield and Gordon Fryer who aren't well.



"After a difficult summer and subsequent start to the season, St Martins have continued their rebuilding as a club both on and off the pitch. It has been little over 12 months since I took over the managerial reigns. The initial task of steadying the ship and moving

the club away from the perilous position of being bottom of the league after 18 games on just 10 points was achieved and the club finished in a respectable 8th position. A dis-jointed pre-season to this season arose because I was away for long periods with an injury, so a very small squad struggled, worsened by lack of player availability, which resulted in the Saints very poor start to the season.

Recently, however, we have bounced back magnificently and are currently in our best form of the season having won the last five matches in all competitions. The team are playing some excellent football and are scoring lots of goals, providing excellent entertainment for those coming to watch matches. The squad now has more stability, and whilst it is still very small, I feel that this squad is adequately equipped for the challenges that lie ahead in the last four months of the season.

The run of good performances started with a four goal hammering of Wrens Nest, followed by a nervier 4-3 win against Gornal. A comfortable Ethlestone Cup quarter-final win against Penley saw the Saints score ten goals to setup a semi-final meeting with Allscott. The Saints got their first double of the league season by winning 3-1 away at Allscott at the end of December, so fingers crossed for a win in that semi-final. To cap this fine run, the lads beat top of the 'West Midland League' Division One, Newport Town, 1-0 at home on Saturday 6th January with a very professional performance that should have yielded a lot more goals.

The Saints can now look forward to fighting on 4 fronts for the remainder of the season:The League, League Cup, Ethleston Cup and the TJ Vickers Shropshire Premier Cup.
The biggest priority though is finishing high enough to get the club to its highest ever level of football for next season". *Dan Stevens. St. Martin's FC Manager.*

On behalf of the 'St. Martins FC Club Committee', *Chairman Terry Ellis*, thanks Dan and the team for their efforts, stating that;


