From the Chair

Occasionally I get the comment, "You're on the Parish Council? And its Chairman?" Well, yes, I am, and also its Chairman, for one more year. It is not hard to know that fact. Names of Parish Councillors are in the Village Life Magazine. Our names are printed on Parish Council Minutes which are publicly displayed on village notice boards and on our Parish Council website. The information is there, if one has the time to read it. And, if one has the interest.

The trouble with modern life is that there is a cyberspace competition to download as much information into our lives as possible. One effect is that we learn to filter out that information which we consider irrelevant to our own lives. Another effect is that we learn to safeguard our own free time, to protect our own time so that it is hopefully free from stress, hassle, and unwarranted intrusions. The downside to that exclusion zone is that we can get inward-looking and not consider the affairs of others – unless they are our immediate family. But, in a sense, village life is like a big family. Families love one another, and then they fight with one another; they look out for each other, and then cross the road to avoid speaking to one another. "Nowt so strange as folk" says ancient wisdom.

Your Parish Council is officially recognised as the first tier in local government. In ancient times and in other cultures, the village elders held council in order to make decisions that would affect local communal life. Today, your Parish Council is extremely limited in its decision making but those that we make we do so with the intention of benefitting our local community. Why? Because we care about our community. We care to try and protect our village from over-development and we care to encourage correct development, such as the new Recreational Site. But this takes time, effort and an outward-looking heart. The majority of our Councillors are pensioners who do have the time, and the interest, and acquired wisdom from life's experience. But we are not immortal and vacancies occur. So let me encourage the younger members of our community – if you have taken the time to read this – to consider getting involved in the affairs of the Parish Council. If you have the free time, and are wondering what to do with it, and be treated with respect, look out for any

vacancy on the Parish Council an think about applying for it. After all, you will be getting involved in village family life.

Report from St Martins Parish Council Clerk

During May the Annual Meeting and Parish Council meeting were held in St Martins Centre.

At the Annual Meeting Cllr Glenn Pennington was re-elected as Chairman of the Parish Council and Cllr Andrew Cast re-elected as Vice-Chairman of the Parish Council. Cllrs were elected to various committees including Executive, Recreation Services, Finance, Street Lighting and Planning. Cllrs were also appointed as representatives to Outside Bodies and Organisations such as the Area Committee of the Shropshire Association of Local Council, Local Joint Committee, Wrekin Housing Trust and Oswestry Heath Group.

At the Council meeting a number of police issues were raised which included Oak Drive – still parking vehicles on verge by Post Box, concern over lack of police presence in village, a requirement to monitor vehicles going on wrong side of mini island by Stan's and the need to monitor speed of traffic coming from Gledrid Roundabout to try and beat traffic lights outside Top Bank Top Industrial Estate.

On planning issues an Outline application (all matters reserved) for the erection of one dwelling on land adjacent to 69 New Ifton, St Martins, Oswestry, Shropshire, SY11 3AA was supported although access to the site was of concern. An application from Shropshire Council for the variation of condition No.1 attached to permission 17/01284/VAR to allow for the family to remain on site at Ifton Heath Former Primary School for a further temporary period of twelve months was again supported although concern was

expressed that Shropshire Council who have a legal position to house this family seem to be doing little to look for an alternative site for them.

All local councils want to serve their local communities and make a real difference to the lives of the people that live there. Therefore the Parish Council has signed up to the Local Council Award Scheme at the Foundation Level. This scheme offers councils the opportunity to show that they meet the standards set by the sector, assessed by their peers, and to put in place the conditions for continued improvement. The scheme also demonstrates that a council meets the requirements for operating lawfully and according to standard practice.

At long last the summer seems to have started after our what felt like an everlasting seems winter, While we all hope the good weather lasts for more than a few days, it will certainly take more than that to deal with the effects of the winter weather which took its toll on the roads not only here in St Martins but also across the whole of Shropshire — and indeed the country — with a record number of potholes appearing as a result of those winter weather conditions.

Shropshire Council repair teams are already out and about starting to fix those pothole problems, and you will have noticed that they started in the village last week. I would like to say that they will all be done quickly, but the sheer volume of work means that it could still take some time to complete. Please let me know if you spot any severe problems that are still outstanding and I'll do my best to ensure that they receive the appropriate priority.

Potholes aside, there is a lot going on behind the scenes. I continue to work with the Parish Council working to secure land donated by lain Hill-Trevor as a sports facility.

We are also still working on the future development of the former Ifton School site to provide mixed use housing and office accommodation as well as looking for a solution to the problems caused by the mini-roundabout junction at Ellesmere Road and Overton Road.

All this is part of working to make St Martins a village of the future without forgetting its past. On that topic, I attended a fundraising event last Friday with the committee and friends of the Ifton Colliery Commemorative Project. I have to say that the planned statue celebrating the people who worked there and the contribution the mine made to the development of our community is awesome and I wish them every success in their efforts to commemorate the 50th anniversary of the end of coal production at Ifton.

As always, please contact me for any issues you have I will always call and see you to discuss and try and help in the community and personally where ever possible,




