Shirley was our delegate at the Shropshire Federation Annual Meeting and gave her report and said that she had thoroughly enjoyed the day, especially one of the speakers, Gyles Brandreth, who was apparently quite hilarious and a bit naughty! She was quite pleased to have ended up sat next to him at one point during the meeting.

We had an inspirational speaker at our May meeting. She is Lieutenant Commander Victoria Graham, retired, who was a burns specialist nurse. Her talk was called "The Biscuit Club" and it came into being when she and the trauma team serving in Afghanistan during the war came together for tea and biscuits each day which they found helped with the stress and long hours of working on the front line and nursing the wounded and dying. It helped them to reconnect with home as a typically British thing to do. They literally sampled 100's of types of biscuits and rated them all. She now gives talks to many clubs and groups about that time in her life and she donates whatever she receives to Forces Charities. 

Small grants for local businesses




