More than 5,000 visitors flock to BBC Antiques Roadshow



As temperatures soared, visitors flooded to the Grade I listed house and garden bringing their family treasures.

No kidding! The Royal Welsh Fusiliers kicked off the BBC event in the morning bringing their mascot - Llywelyn, the goat.

One of the day's highlights was seeing Fiona Bruce cycling a replica Penny Farthing in the picturesque garden.

Volunteers made a huge difference and Fiona Bruce met National Trust's oldest volunteer, Joan Capel, who turned 100 in January.

More than one hundred volunteers helped make a difference at the BBC event in Wrexham, working to ensure visitors enjoyed a day out to remember.

As the BBC publicist for the show, Pamela Parkes said: 'It was a memorable day at Erddig. Thousands of people came along and brought some fantastic treasures and family memorabilia. We filmed enough to make two very special programmes from Erddig which should be broadcast at some point early next year.'

Forty five volunteers donned red sashes and straw boaters working in a variety of roles to support the production. A further twenty were out in the car park helping Erddig's ranger team and the rest supported Erddig's catering, garden, visitor welcome and fundraising efforts. Erddig's bookshop volunteers had a busy day and Joan Capel, the National Trust's oldest volunteer, enjoyed meeting Fiona Bruce on the day.

Jamie Watson, Erddig general manager, said: "It has been wonderful working with the BBC on one of the country's best-loved TV programmes.

"It has been a fantastic opportunity to showcase the property and I must say a huge thank you to our team of staff and over a hundred volunteers who've helped make the day a success."

The day's more unusual visitors included the mascot for the Royal Welsh Fusiliers, a goat named Llywelyn and a bird of prey!

Llywelyn took centre stage to launch the event by leading the queue of waiting visitors to the main reception to the Roadshow as the show's signature tune resounded around the garden walls.

One of the highlights of the day was when a daring Fiona Bruce decided to cycle, as the Yorkes once did, on a replica Penny Farthing along the top path in the garden. Simon

Morris of Mr Phoebe Penny Farthing experience was on hand to set Fiona on her way, watched by hundreds of people in the crowd, luckily the ride went without a hitch!

The day saw some extraordinary things pulled out of bags/trolleys/bits of newspaper/suitcases/boats - and this year even a painting with a goat!

The show's experts had the opportunity to see an exciting array of treasures, including a leather jacket worn by Daniel Craig during filming as James Bond and two sketches by Wales' most famous artist Kyffin Williams. The day also saw a signed personalised letter from Elvis Presley and a Victorian rowing machine.

Soaring temperatures meant that the event organisers changed the queue route to run between the garden's pleached limes, offering much-needed shade. The art of pleaching, or training trees to create a wall for shade, was popular in the 17th and 18th Century. The garden team set up free water points along the lime trees to keep visitors hydrated.

National Trust operational risk consultant, Nick Howells – who volunteered to help the Erddig team on the day said:

“The garden team has been working around the clock to prevent the summer bedding scheme from wilting in the sunshine.

For the Antiques Roadshow, we were all working to prevent *visitors* from wilting.

I refilled the forty litre water carrier that I was using twenty five times, that's one thousand litres of water!”

Visitor Welcome Assistant Sharon Laurence was busy on the day promoting Erddig's apple harvest event by offering visitors apples for the journey home. She managed to have a chat to Fiona Bruce, who took an apple as she was leaving.

Sharon said:

“It was a fantastic day and I was so proud to be part of it. I got to meet a goat, a soldier and a celebrity!

As Fiona was leaving and took an apple for her journey home, I asked her what she thought of Erddig.

She said it was her second visit and that it was an absolutely beautiful place and all the staff were so happy, kind and helpful. I can't argue with that.”

A picturesque country house Erddig, on the Welsh borders, dates back to the 17th century. The last owner, Philip Yorke III inherited a crumbling Erddig on the death of his brother Simon. Neither brother had married, so Philip began negotiations to entrust Erddig to the National Trust. The National Trust took ownership in 1973 and began a four-year period of restoration, opening again in 1977.

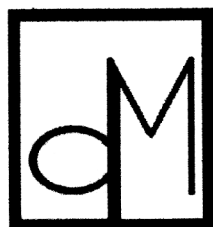

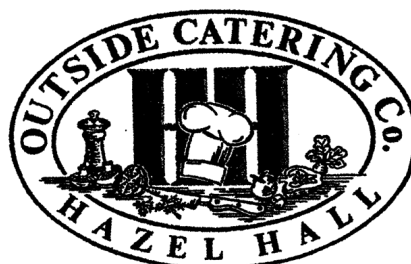

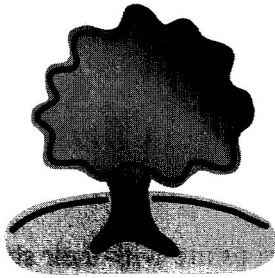

JANUARY 2019 MEETING

At our meeting on 8th January President Shirley Willis welcomed everyone and wished us all a Happy New Year. We had one visitor. We sang Jerusalem and then had a short business meeting. We then welcomed our speaker Pam Hillier who is a volunteer controller for the Shropshire, Staffordshire, Cheshire Blood Bikes charity, or SSC Bloodbikes for short. She gave a talk with slides. This charity transports for free by motorbike, blood and blood products, human breast milk, medicines, and takes samples to and from laboratory for testing when any of these are needed in an emergency. I was very surprised to learn that they rely entirely on voluntary staff and have no money from the NHS or government. The bikes alone cost £13,000 each and this plus the fuel, insurance and tax takes most of their budget. The bikers provide all their own clothing, helmets etc. The controllers work the telephone from their own home thus keeping overheads to a minimum. The Orthopaedic Hospital benefits from this service but she tells us there are no bikers from our local area volunteering at the moment! She was thanked on our behalf by Angela Ree. We then had a short presentation from President Shirley Willis about the history of the W.I. movement that she gave at the Qube late last year for their Oswestry's Home Front Heroines and Wilfred Owen centenary celebration. She was thanked by Helen Williams.

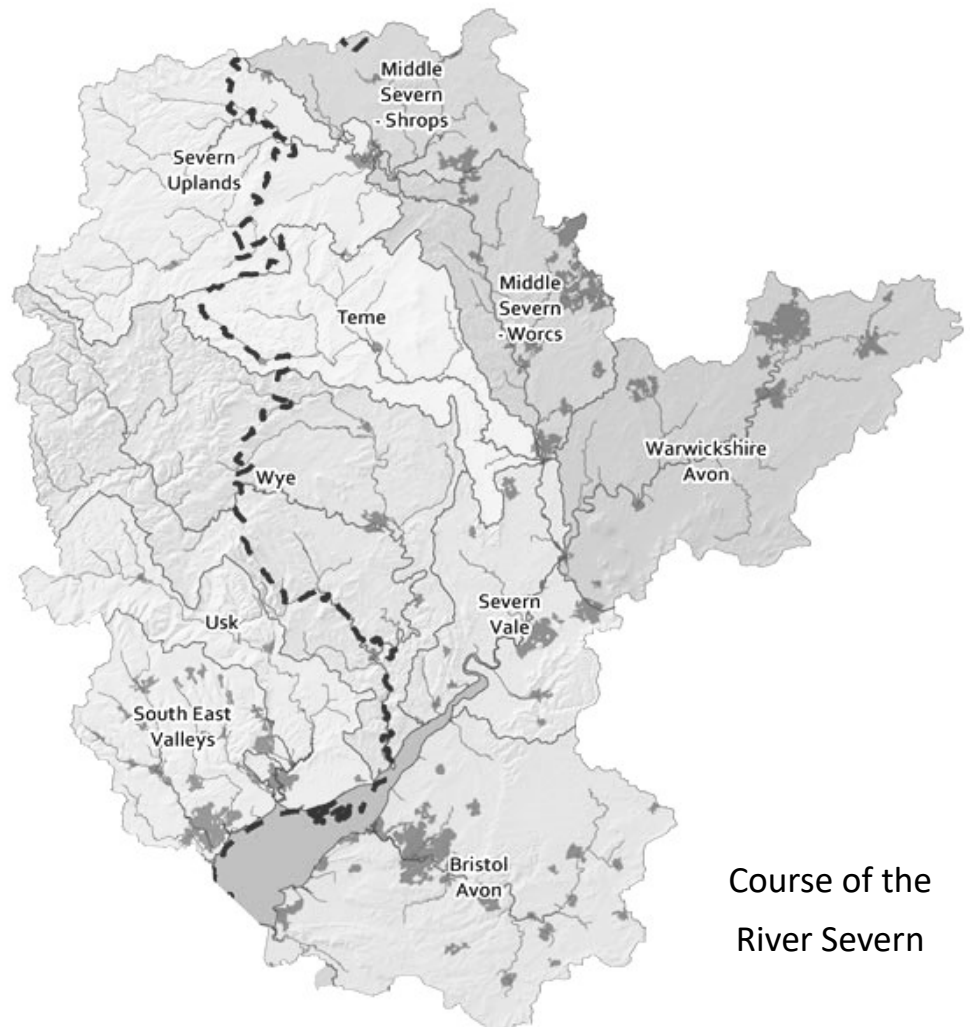
Alex also gave an update on how the project has been delivered in the following two years and planning for 2019 and on various other projects the Wildlife Trust are undertaking.

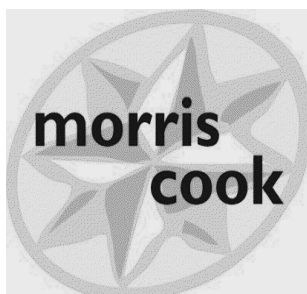

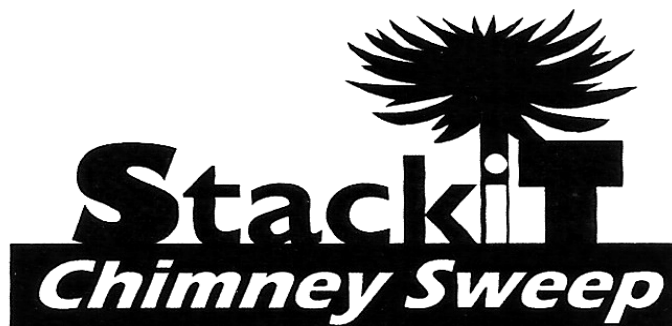
