Summer is nearly half way through and hay is being made on the days that make this rural area where we live a joy. It's just a shame that so many people are unable to take home all the rubbish that they feel impelled to throw out of their car windows or from open hands, turning some our lanes into longitudinal rubbish dumps. If only they thought of the consequences of their thoughtless actions - and don't start me on the topics of fly-tipping and people who don't clear up after their dogs! Let's just keep St Martins tidy. These thoughts were going through my mind on a recent walk through our own and neighbouring villages when we came across 3 hedgehogs that had been run over by vehicles. In Great Britain we appear to have lost over half of the hedgehogs from our countryside since the millennium. I know that not all of those are due to being runover, but if we could all be a little more careful when driving through our narrow lanes it might help. Obviously the highway code states that you must not endanger any person in seeking to avoid hitting an animal.

In this month's Parish Council meeting we got some very positive news from our Unitary councillor Steve Davenport regarding the resolution of the unsatisfactory (and dangerous) roundabout by Stan's, with possible progress on the redesign of this junction. Steve will no doubt cover this further in his articles in the magazine.

Councillors also agreed that in future, whenever possible, there would be a site visit to review all planning application sites in the village, to better understand each application and to assess its impact on the area.

Councillor Glenn Pennington, reporting on the activities of the Community Speed Watch team, stated that they were very short of members which is limiting their ability to carry out this vital task. If you have some free time and would like to help, please contact Councillor Pennington, whose details you can find on the next page.

Finally, in the spirit of public service I mentioned in the last issue that we need 2 new councillors to fill the places left by recent resignations. Notices have now been put up in the village, so if you are interested in joining us on the Council please contact our

Report from St Martins Parish Council Clerk

There are now two casual vacancies on the Parish Council following the recent resignations of Sue Schofield and John Sands. No by-election has been requested, so these vacancies will be filled by co-option. Expressions of interest are welcomed from anyone in the community who is over 18 years old. As a councillor representing your community you will help keep it a great place to live and work. Members of the Parish Council attended St Martins School Open Day on the 28th June 2019 to provide an update on the proposed new recreation site being planned for development behind the school under the banner of *St Martins Recreation Partnership*. A TV screen showed a rolling PowerPoint display with schematics of the proposed site around the School and an accompanying explanation of the background. A copy of the Power Point was left with the School. These plans are still at the planning application stage with Shropshire Council. The overall impression is that there is a growing interest and excitement in the community about the new recreational site.



A working group from the Parish Council are looking at various options for the installation of a number of Vehicle Activated Signs to try and encourage motorists to reduce their speed through the village. Councillors expressed concern that the Safety Camera Partnership team do not operate in St Martins with their speed enforcement cameras compared with adjoining villages and would be requesting a change to this procedure and alternate their vehicle more between all our rural villages.


Shropshire Councillor Steve Davenport reported that he was now awaiting design work to start on various options to improve the junction at the mini roundabout at the junction of Overton and Ellesmere Roads. As regards the postponed resurfacing of Overton Road, he reported that due to the many concerns he received about the road closures for this work he had now lost this money to another scheme in the County, but that he was working to obtain new funding that would allow the work to take place in the near future.

There is no Parish Council meeting in August. The next meeting will be held on the Thursday 12th September 2019 at 7.00 pm at The Moors.

As the summer moves swiftly along I hope those who can get away have a lovely time and by the time this comes out, Brian and Sue Atherton will have come back from a well deserved holiday. To those who can't get away, I hope you will be able to enjoy our lovely countryside, we are so lucky where we live.

I've been asked to update you on our recycling in Shropshire and how we compare nationally, well there's more to do, but we recycle 54.7% compared with the national average of 44.8% so while it could be better, its not too bad.

In terms of actual figures, it looks something like this,

86,170 tonnes goes to be recycled

67,620 tonnes goes to be burned in Shrewsbury to produce electricity

3,300 tonnes goes to landfill.

I hope this helps, but I can go into more detail if requested

Update on roads in the village. Overton Road is still due to be resurfaced soon, but this will be done over the weekends and evenings to avoid less disruption to business.

We have now got funding to improve the mini roundabout outside Stans, although at the moment I'm not sure how as I'm still waiting for junction design options.

FRIENDS OF IFTON MEADOWS LOCAL NATURE RESERVE

As you know we have been surveying the butterflies on the Meadows over the last few months, although the mixed weather has meant that some weeks we have been unable to do surveys. Dull days mean fewer butterflies are out, but the sunny days that we have been having have made a huge difference.

On 5th July we counted 173 butterflies around the seven sections monitored - mainly two species, Ringlets(63) and Meadow Browns(64), along with small white, common blue, Red Admiral, Painted Lady and some small skippers. This is the highest number we have ever recorded on any



one day. Over the last few **mon**ths we have also seen a change in the type of butterflies found on site. We are not experts and they move so quickly it is sometimes difficult to Identify them but we do our best.



The flower survey of the Horse Field on 14th June gave us 56 species, followed a week later by 11 types of grass - these are very difficult to ID.

You will have noticed several parties working on site, some from schools and some from business's. Work places now hold 'team-building days' for their employees and we have had several of these groups on site recently, overseen by either Mike or Lee (Rangers from Shropshire Council). At the moment they are working around the boundary, clearing scrub from along the fence line so that work can be done to make the boundary animal proof.

There are several events planned on site for August/summer holidays so keep an eye out for details.

We continue to work on the 2nd Sunday of each month (weather permitting) 1.30pm to 4pm. We need to keep pathways open and also remove birch and brambles which are taking over several areas of the site. Helpers always welcome.
