

END OF AN ERA

Have you noticed something missing when you pass Bank Top? Yes, the Water Tower has gone.

Built in 1943 the tower had 3 floors all of reinforced concrete about 12 inches thick and walls of about 14 inches thick. At the top was a concrete water tank lined with a membrane to make it water tight. The other floors were used for storage. This tower survived earthquakes



and high winds and has stood the test of time.

Bank Top was originally built as a POW camp for both Germans and Italians and then after the war it was used for displaced persons. At the time of its construction there was only a small pipe to service the village with water and anytime water was drawn at the camp there wasn't any water in the village. The only way to rectify this was to build the towers to be filled over night with 15,000 gallons ready for the next day. There were about 7 smaller towers with header tanks against specific units, which were fed by gravity from this main tower. These smaller towers were all situated around the camp, supplying the Hospital block, Canteen, NAAFI Staff quarters and large ablution block etc.

The dismantling started on a Friday in July, it took all day for this JCB to make a hole in the top layer (maybe they should have got the late Fred Dibner to work his magic). Back then they sure knew how to construct a strong landmark although it only took the next day to demolish the rest and by 14:10 on the Sunday it was "razed to the ground".

This is all to make way for the construction of new industrial units by Brynkinalt Estate.
