This year as in previous years the parish council has put up twenty hanging baskets on various street lighting lamp posts through the village. These were again planted and put up by Neil Rheade.

Also, our thanks go to Greg Moore who has made and donated a large wooden planter for the Memorial Garden plus two small wooden planters that are positioned either side of the Miners Bench in front of the Institute.

# Report from St Martins Parish Council Clerk

Following the parish council elections in May this year, only thirteen electors stood for election. This resulted in no election but left two vacancies on the parish council. One has now been filled but there is still one vacancy. Please see details on the notice boards and the website. However recently we received a letter of resignation from Paula Rooney who was leaving the area. This has now created a casual vacancy which again details have been published on the notice boards and the website. With no meeting in August, we hope to fill both these vacancies before our September meeting.

All Parish Councillor's contact details are included in this edition of the Village Life.

At the Annual Meeting of the parish council in May Cllr Helen Williams was re-elected as Chairman with Cllr Nina Mistry being re-elected as Vice-Chairman of the parish council.

On highways, discussions are still taking place with Shropshire Council on design work to try and improve the traffic flow around the mini roundabout by Stans Superstore. In addition, extra signage and road markings have been requested either side of Escob bridge. Shropshire Council have also been asked to carry out a feasibility study on installing traffic lights on either side of this bridge.

A recreation project team has been set up with members from the parish council, school and football club to oversee the new all-weather community recreation facility adjacent to St Martins School. A Business Plan has been agreed and work on the new access to the site will commence in August.

Concern is still being expressed by the parish council and local residents over the closure of the doctor's surgery in St Martins. Despite talks between Shropshire Councillor Steve Davenport, representatives from the parish council, the Clinical Commissioner Groups (CCG) and Rachel Robinson, Head of Public Health at Shropshire Council with the Practice Manager and other representatives from Chirk Surgery, at this stage they seem reluctant to reopen it. Originally it was closed since the start of the pandemic as they were not able to continue to manage service delivery at

the site during this time to comply with the socially distancing requirements. Now they are stating that they do not have the staff to manage this surgery and the surgery is unsuitable because of its size of rooms for future use. Discussions are still taking place.

The parish council continue to comment on planning application submitted to Shropshire Council. Shropshire Council's planning officer still has concerns over the proposed development at the old Ifton School site mainly due to noise levels from the adjacent business park and whether the school building should be retained.

The next meeting of the parish council will be held in St Martins Centre at 7.00 pm on Thursday 9<sup>th</sup> September 2021.



# St Martins School and Ridgway Rentals

In 2018, pupils of St Martins School worked hard on making a storyboard to go next to the miner's statue to tell the story behind it.

Cassy Price and Dylan Arias (pictured) were two of the students who worked on the project which was led by Mrs Jones (pictured).

On commemoration Day on 23<sup>rd</sup> November 2018, the final board was not totally ready for display so the draft board was displayed and now has been returned to the school for future projects. The Board was presented to the school by Mr Terry Ellis on behalf of the project committee.

Since then, the final story board was completed and has been framed and mounted on legs made of very solid materials so will hopefully stay on display for many years to come.

Local plant hire company, Ridgway Rentals Ltd. kindly paid for the making of the storyboard and Managing Director, Stuart Jones, was asked to reveal it at the ceremony on Saturday 12<sup>th</sup> June.

Stuart said "We were glad to support such a meaningful project. The story behind the statue is so important and commemorates the miners and their part in the development of the village. I am also glad that I was able to be a part of the day to reveal the storyboard for all to see."

New bronze plaques were also added to the base of the Miner's Statue that list all the miners names that sadly died whilst working in the local mine and tells a narrative about why the statue is there for current and future residents & visitors.






This week year 10 GCSE Geography students had an extremely successful day by the coast where they visited Talacre beach as part of their fieldwork requirement for their GCSE exam. They went to investigate what makes the sand dunes a distinctive landscape, where students completed a transect through the dunes to look at biodiversity. They also took part in some conservation work with the local rangers to remove ragwort and clematis, two invasive species in the dune complex. 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
