





St. Martins 0 Sandbach 8



St. Martins FC were understandably cautious as they persuaded their determination to break a run of defeats but good fortune didn't arrive, in -fact basic misfortune influenced another heavy defeat. The opening two Sandbach goals scored by Bryan Barton in the 4th minute and Sheikh Islam in the 30th minute looked suspiciously off-side, sadly an opinion that the Lines-man didn't share.

A direct ball behind the Saints defence found George West who calmly placed his shot neatly into the corner of the net to increase Sandbach's lead in the 40th minute. In defiance of the score the Saints keeper 'Troy Taylor' was playing well but had been booked earlier for a misdemeana disrupting a Sandbach attack so was devastated when his lose tackle halting another attack, resulted in him being sent off.

To add insult to injury Neil Cope increased Sandbach's lead in the 51st minute leaving the 10-man Saints team pondering their fate in the second half. That fait, was worsened when the Saints energetic mid-fielder, Daniel Fat-Cande, was sent-off for his behaviour in a violent incident involving a scramble of players from both sides but Daniel was the only player sent-off?

As a result, it was no surprise when Sandbach tore apart the Saints 9 men with goals scored by Stanley Tatters in the 75 minute and George West fired home his second goal in the 78th minute, Jim Burring completed Sandbach's rout scoring in the 81st and 89th minute. Unfortunately, this game, epitomised the Saints disappointing season involving a 100% effort but not equalled by good fortune.

St. Martins 1 Abbey-Hey 5

St. Martins FC hosted this clash with Abbey-Hey that started at pace with both teams utilising a cavalier approach so pursuing attacks but it was Abbey-Hey 's Jake Parker who broke the deadlock in the 17th minute latching onto a through ball that split the Saints hitherto efficient defensive high-line and placing the ball calmly into the back of the net to give his side the lead.

In defiance of this opening goal the Saints maintained their efficient defensive high-line catching their opponents off-side time and time again but this was a strategy that held some anxiety for their fans who dwelt their concentration on that high line which was constantly close to exposure. A fear that was subsequently realised as Abbey-Hey forward Jordan Lazenbury timed his run perfectly and chipped Saints' keeper Troy Taylor as they faced a one-to-one clash so everyone in the ground watched the ball drop into the empty net, increasing the Abbey's lead in the 37th minute.

Sadly, for the Saints, this goal opened the door of opportunity for their opponents as the hitherto stout Saints' defence cracked conceding goals scored by Jake Parker in the 41st minute and Ben Haifacre in the 44th minute providing a bewildering 4 goal lead at half-time.

It must have been a difficult half time team-talk for Saints Manager Darren Wildman but to his despair, Jake Parker, who had proven to be a permanent thorn in the Saints side scored the third goal of his hattrick and his team's fifth goal in the 48th minute.

In spite of the pressure via conceding more goals the Saints' had continued to attack but were subsequently easier to expose in the counter-attack so it wasn't a surprise when Ben Halfacre fired home his team's 6th goal in the 61st minute.

To conclude, Emanuel Ferandes calmly fired home what was one of the most impressive goals of the game but scored in the 76th minute, sadly too late for a St. Martins' recovery!

Wythenshawe Amateurs FC 9 St. Martins FC 0

St. Martins experienced a thrashing in their away game to Wythenshawe Town who sit in third place of the 'North West Counties League Division 1 South' leaving St. Martins FC floundering at the bottom of that League. Wythenshawe's dominance was soon identified as William Shawcross scored their opening goal in the 15th minute, the first of a hattrick that he completed scoring in the 31st and 48th minute.

Saul Henderson fired home Wythenshawe's second goal in the 19th minute and he too completed a hattrick then scoring in the 31st and 49th minutes. Samuel Adewusi placed his name on the score-sheet in the 24th minute whilst Arthur Okonkwo in the 82nd and Francesco Frangillo in the 88th minute placed the final nails in St. Martins coffin scoring the 8th and 9th goals for a delighted Wythenshawe Amateurs.

St. Martins FC 0 Ellesmere FC 5

This local derby between St. Martins and Ellesmere has a long and interesting history as both clubs experience ups and down, both are currently playing at the highest level of their club's histories in the 'North West Counties League Division 1 South'. This season has been the most challenging in that history for St. Martins, who have had three different managers within the recent campaign. Current Manager, Darren Wildman is determined to transform that negativity introducing new players but has still to turn that corner of form as the club languishes at the bottom of the league gaining only two points via two draws in the whole of the season.

Ellesmere were the initial home team but the recent severe weather resulted in the game being switched to the Saints current home-ground at Park Hall which has an artificial pitch but this didn't provide the opportunity for the Saints to capture their first win of the season.

Ellesmere took an early lead in the 14th minute via Owen Lloyd and two goals scored by Josh Dunne in the 45th and 87th minute and two fired-home by David Howorth in the 58th and 70th minute gave Ellesmere a comfortable win, following recent below-form performances. The Saints' manager, Darren Wildman maintains a determination to transform the Saints' form and finish the season, winning!

St. Martins FC 0 Maine Road 7



Legal Matters – Estate Planning Solutions




