Report from St Martins Parish Council Clerk

The Annual Meeting of St Martins Parish Council was held in St Martins Village Hall on the 12th May 2022.

Councillor Helen Williams was re-elected as Chairman of the Parish Council with Neil Arthan taking over as Vice- Chairman. Councillors were elected on-to various committees including Executive, Finance, Recreation Services, Planning and Street Lighting. In addition, Councillors were appointed to the following Outside Bodies and Organisations; St Martins Recreation Partnership, Area Committee of the Shropshire Association of Local Councils, Oswestry Health Group and Ifton School Development Stakeholder Group.

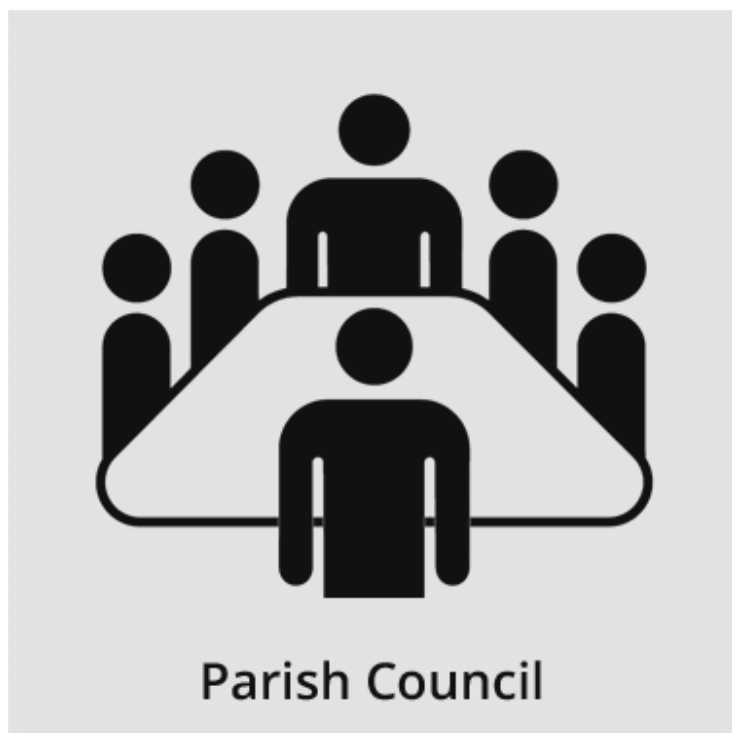
As regards the development at the old Ifton School, as we reported in the last issue that for many years the parish council have been concerned over the capacity of the main sewerage system through the village following all the new development over the last few years. We understand now that the developers have had to delay the start of their work pending an updated plan of the drainage system along Overton Road following a recent CCTV survey.

There is still confusion over the future of the Doctors Branch Surgery in St Martins. It has been established through the Land Registry that two retired Doctors now own the site. The latest update we have received from the Chirk Surgery was that they had been advised that the next decision meeting on the future of the Surgery is due to take place at the end of May after which further discussions will then be held with our MP Helen Morgan, Shropshire Council and the CCG over the future of this branch surgery.

Unfortunately, the owner of the three Take-away shops just before the school has still not responded to our concerns over the dangerous state of the fencing adjacent to their car park and the state of the wooden fencing surrounding the Electricity Sub Station next to these shops. This matter was reported to Shropshire Council's Highways department who can take no action on our concerns.

The tree planting scheme organised through Councillor Sophie Hughes-Saunier and the many volunteers who carried out a tree planting scheme in the village and surrounding highway verges over the weekend of the 12th/13th March was partly successful although a number of trees had to be removed and planted in other areas due to concerns from land owners who required access to hedge and verge cutting and visibility displays.

On Saturday April 21st about 80 residents of St. Martins gathered outside the surgery building to meet with our M.P, Helen Morgan to call for the reopening of the surgery. As parishioners will know a huge effort has been made by the Parish Council, Steve Davenport and Chirk surgery patients to re-establish health care provision in the village. It looks increasingly likely that Shropshire will take over the provision. If that happens patients should be assured that they can still remain at Chirk surgery if they want to.

If a practice is to be established in the village by Shropshire Clinical provision group patients can still access Welsh provision such as Maelor Hospital and Glan Clwyd. G.P. practices are run as business with individual G.P.s becoming partners and buying into the practice with loans from the Health Authority.

Landmark moments

at new housing development

The demolition of the former Ifton Heath school was a landmark moment in the development of the Ifton Green site for Cornovii Developments Ltd and for local . Groundworks have now started and Cornovii's construction partner McPhillips is making great inroads into developing the site and constructing 35 new sustainable homes which will help local people looking to get a foot on the property ladder.



Dean Carroll, Shropshire Council's Cabinet Member for Physical Infrastructure, said: "We recognise it was difficult for many local people who held fond memories to see the school building demolished, but this development is an exciting opportunity to deliver sustainable, affordable homes for local people.

"Ifton Green, will bring a mix of two, three and four-bedroom homes, and a range of styles including detached, semi-detached houses and bungalows and allows for a natural community to develop. We will be supporting everyone from young families to people looking to downsize or seeking a home for their retirement."

Steve Davenport, Shropshire Councillor for St Martins, added: "I am looking forward to the development becoming established and seeing local people have the opportunity to get on the property ladder close to home.

"Memories of the old school building will also be honoured in the fabric of the development with elements such as bricks and the old date stone being incorporated into the design."

Harpreet Rayet, Managing Director of Cornovii Developments Ltd Shropshire Council's wholly owned homebuilding company, said: "We are committed to being good neighbours throughout the construction process and will do our best to mitigate against disturbance and dust.

"McPhillips Ltd is a local contractor and has great experience in working to deliver our objectives to create local employment opportunities, deliver high quality sustainable homes and work in partnership with the local community."

All properties at Ifton Green will be built to achieve 31% higher energy efficiency standards than an average new build home and benefit from solar panels, smart technology and increased insulation levels.

The project, which includes 13 affordable homes, is set for completion in autumn 2023 and forms part of Shropshire Council's house building programme to deliver 1,000 new homes in the county by 2025.

FRIENDS OF IFTON MEADOWS

We are now back on our weekly butterfly survey for Shropshire Council and The Butterfly Conservation Trust. Every week we walk the reserve and note the species and numbers of butterflies that we come across, eight feet in front, to each side and above us. We will do this now until end of September. Currently we are seeing Peacocks, Orange Tips, Speckled Woods, Whites. As the summer progresses we will see the Meadow Browns, Ringlets, Common Blues, Holly Blues, Gatekeepers, Skippers.

Walking around the reserve I think it is hard not to notice the good work undertaken by Mike and Lee, in particular a good amount of the birch has been cut down on the southern slope of the reserve.

As this goes to print the Wild Garlic and Bluebells will be going to seed and we will start to see more Greater Stitchwort, Speedwells. The grasses will be growing taller on the events field and producing flower heads and amongst them will be potentillas, geranium and birds foot trefoil. What a marvel the Reserve is, a free to enter space of wildness. A lot is currently being mentioned on television about rewilding Britain, well Ifton Meadows is an early example of this, an old industrial site, the colliery waste site, now turned into a green space. And when you walk around the reserve, breathe it all in and think about how St Martin's is changing with all the homes being built, all those open fields and vista disappearing under brick, concrete and tarmac, all those lovely views being private-ised, completely the reverse of what has been done on the Meadows. So visit and enjoy, take a seat on one of the benches, listen to the skylarks singing and the bees buzzing and feel freedom and relaxed. Enjoy the coming warm summer days and evenings.

Since I last wrote in March we have had three workdays - March saw us on the far side of the site near Pen y banc working on the wildlife corridor we planted in 2003/4.

We removed a section of the willow that is overtaking the more beneficial trees allowing the birds better access. Some of the willow was over 8ft tall and would soon have reached the electric cable above. April on the other hand needed a different approach - with the help of two new volunteers we did the annual trim of the hedges along the lower pathway and in May we cut back some birch and bramble in the railway field and started removing the foliage that is blocking the water getting through the pipe that runs under the path near the kissing gate at the main entrance. All these jobs need hands on work if you could help please get in touch (01978.710327) or turn up on the second Sunday of each month at 1.30p.m.

Two unwelcome finds on the site are Giant Hog Weed and the Alder Beetle, the Hog Weed has been removed by a lady who is licensed to do this, she was also the one who identified and informed us about it. I would like to thank her for being so observant and also for informing us about the presence of Alder Beetles on site. Hog weed is a non native and invasive plant which can cause burns, Alder beetles eat the leaves of alder and other trees causing them to die.

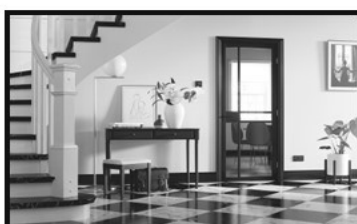
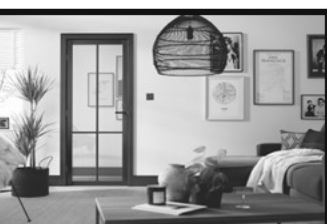

Western Rhyn Gardening Club

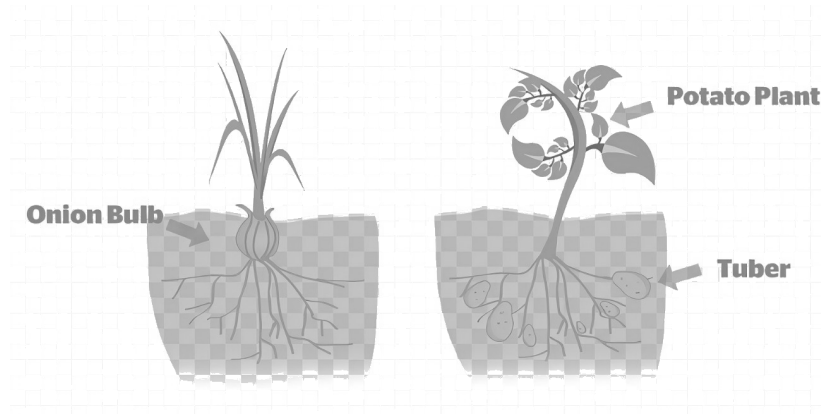

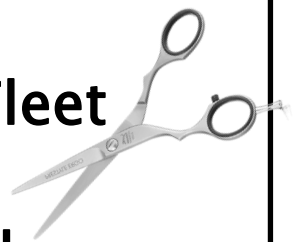
