

Report from St Martins Parish Council Clerk

The last meeting of St Martins Parish Council was held in St Martins Village Hall on the Thursday 14th July 2022.

As regards the future of the Doctors Branch Surgery in St Martins, as reported in the last issue two retired Doctors from Chirk Surgery did own the property in St Martins. However, Cllr's expressed concern over a number of false statements received from the Practice Manager from Chirk Surgery on why they had decided to close this branch surgery after the parish council had put a case forward that it should remain open. The surgery has been part of our community for many years and the building was originally a school and was owned by the Parochial Parish Council and the Lichfield Diocese until 1994 when it was then purchased by the then partners of Chirk surgery, at a purchase price reflecting its use as a community building. The parish council has now written to the Practice Manager at Chirk Surgery asking them to look favourably at our request for a valuation to enable us to work with partners and stakeholders, including themselves to provide local health and care services from the building. We are the largest village in Shropshire without local health care provision; therefore, we have requested a prompt reply to our offer to purchase the building at a fair and reasonable price on behalf of the community and retained as a community asset.

As regards the development at the old Ifton School (now called Ifton Green), as we reported in the last issue that for many years the parish council have been concerned over the capacity of the main sewerage system through the village following all the new development over the last few years. This resulted in a substantial delay in work due to issues specific to the drainage. However, an agreement had been reached with Welsh Water to use the pipe which runs towards Ridgeway Rentals. The pipe will be in need of some relining and the contractors confirmed that 100% of the water and waste will be directed to this pipe. No waste or grey water will run into the Overton Road pipes but the developers will re-line that pipe with a hope it helps the general area.

In the same area concern had previously been made to Shropshire Council over the insufficient staff parking at the Shropshire Home for children with special needs. The contractors on the adjoining housing development had liaised with Shropshire Council about the parking restrictions and had made provision for 4 off-road parking spaces during the development. Shropshire Council had approved this temporary scheme.

The parish council are looking into why we are experiencing intermittent breaks in power with the four speed indicator devices in the village. An engineer from Morelock Signs has visited the area and is now looking at the capacity of the batteries in relation to the power from the solar panels.

There is no parish council meeting in August, but residents should contact any of the parish councillors should they have any urgent parish matters of concern. Their contact details are all listed in this magazine.

The next meeting of the parish council will be held in St Martins Village Hall on Thursday 8th September at 7.00 pm.



Ifton Meadows Local Nature Reserve

FRIENDS OF IFTON MEADOWS

As stated in the May issue we are now back on our weekly butterfly survey for Shropshire Council and The Butterfly Conservation Trust. We will do this now until end of September - on site over the last month we have seen a reduction in the number of butterflies and also all the bumblebees seem to have disappeared. We have noticed this also

happening in our gardens. Not sure if this magazine will we printed by the time the Big Butterfly Count takes place between 15th July and 7th August but if you are interested I have included the details. The **Big Butterfly Count** is a nationwide citizen science survey (similar to the Big Bird Count) aimed at helping us assess the health of our environment. It was launched in 2010 and has rapidly become the world's biggest survey of butterflies. Over 107,000 citizen scientists took part in 2021, submitting 152,039 counts of butterflies and day-flying moths from across the UK.

We count butterflies because not only are they beautiful creatures to be around but they are also extremely important. They are vital parts of the ecosystem as both pollinators and components of the food chain. However, they are under threat. Numbers of butterflies and moths in the UK have decreased significantly since the 1970s. This is a warning that cannot be ignored.

Butterfly declines are also an early warning for other wildlife losses. Butterflies are key biodiversity indicators for scientists as they react very quickly to changes in their environment. Therefore, if their numbers are falling, then nature is in trouble. So tracking numbers of butterflies is crucial in the fight to conserve our natural world. That's why taking part in this massive citizen science enterprise is of great importance not just for our butterflies but for the wider environment and biodiversity in general.

The Big Butterfly Count 2022 reopens on 1st July ready for the main event between 15th July and 7th August. All the counts can be viewed on the <u>interactive map</u>. If we are too late for you to join in this year check the results on line to see whether the decline we are seeing here are the same Nationwide.

June saw us cut back the grass around the stone near the main entrance clearing the area around the Yew tree we planted last year. Our concern was that someone would come along with a strimmer and cut it down, unfortunately the dogs decided to use it to mark their territory so we had to put a guard around it (hopefully that will save it). We have also continued to cut back the birch which was growing in the ditch by the path to the Mosaic and treated the notice board with a preservative. We need more help with this type of job, so if you are interested please join us on 2nd Sunday of each Month 1.30p.m. or get it touch with Mike at the Rangers office 01691- 624448 or more details.

The Buttercups on site have given us a good display and if you look carefully underneath them you will find other flowers such as Common Spotted Orchid and the even rarer Bee Orchid. Take pictures with pleasure but do not remove, leave them for others to enjoy and for them to seed for next year.

On the down side following the Highway Departments work at the Railway entrance the pond is again silting up and I have never seen it looking so dead, hopefully when we start to get more water running through we can do something about it and bring it back to its former glory.



Sited on the village outskirts, members of the St Martins Allotment Association enjoy the pleasure and challenge of growing a wide range of fresh fruit and veg using various techniques, from the traditional method of cultivation to a more recent approach of No-Dig.

The concept of allotments dates back many hundreds of years. Interest in growing your own experienced peaks during the first and second world war.
