Summer Gardening Tips

With colourful blooms to enjoy, fruit to pick, wildlife to watch, seeds to sow and veg to harvest, the summer months are rewarding for many

To help you make the most of the season we've asked our gardeners to share their tips on a variety of topics, including roses, pruning, lawn care, and much more.

At this time of year, it's a good idea to trim your perennials so that they flower for longer and keep their strength and vigour. It's also important to deadhead flowering plants to keep them healthy and blooming for as long as possible.

Many gardeners like to do the 'Hampton Court' hack in July. This method involves taking the shoot of a plant in your flower border and cutting back by roughly a third.

You may not need to water as much as you think, especially if the soil is healthy and the ground is covered by plants or mulches. Give your plants a drink if they are starting to wilt but don't just water the surface of the soil as this will cause shallow rooting. It's best to water your garden first thing in the morning or in the evening.

Our gardeners warn against a lot of digging in dry weather as it damages the soil structure, increases moisture loss and disturbs plant roots.

Late summer is a good time to plant autumn bulbs, including cyclamens, colchicums and dahlias. You can also take and raise cuttings from your favourite flowering plants, so you have a plentiful supply for next year.





St Martins Community Speedwatch

Our Community Speed-watch Campaign has been extremely active over the past couple of months at various locations across our village and we have to give our thanks to the small group of volunteers who continue to act as a monitoring team to maintain safety for everyone.

We continue to be dismayed at the number of vehicles who still completely ignore the regulatory speed limit of 30mph and over the past 8 weeks, we have reported 31 vehicles to West Mercia Police.

One of the most shocking episodes was recently witnessed close to Marsland Close, Ellesmere Road, where an already speeding van was OVERTAKEN by a Grey coloured 68-plate Skoda Octavia car, travelling towards Ellesmere, which was then recorded at a speed of FIFTY ONE mph by the time it reached Mount Bradford Lane. If any vehicle had been exiting Firs Close or Oakfield Close, then there would surely have been a serious accident/fatle crash!

There is NO EXCUSE for such reckless driving; the vehicle has been identified and reported to our police colleagues for their ongoing attention. If you were the driver, then expect an envelope to drop through your letter-box in the near future.





Grants

Over the last 8 years Three Parishes Big Local have awarded over **£400,000** in grants through 3 streams. Community chest grants to Community Groups and places of up to £500, Small Business grants and support of up to £500 to small businesses in the Three Parishes, and Big Grants for projects, community groups and buildings that met the 3PBL Community Aspitations.

Some of this money has been match funded, bringing even more money into the area. Some has supported new initiatives and others have left legacies – making a lasting impact on the Three Parishes Big Local area.

My Money Matters

This service is still available 3 days a week and offers residents of the Three Parishes Big Local area free, confidential, support and advice identifying any benefits and/or tax relief they may be entitled to. So far, this has helped residents receive over £800k they previously didn't know how to, or that they could claim. If your household situation has changed and / or you think you maybe entitiled to any government support and/or reductions on what you're paying, or just need some help with filling in forms, do get in touch with Karen. As restrictions continue to lift this service has returned to each village, and continues to be available over the phone for those living or working in the Three Parishes.
