FROM THE CHAIR

On behalf of every one of our Parish Councillors, we wish you all a Very Happy New Year. I don't know if it was just me, but 2023 seemed to flash past in the blink of an eye.

For those of you who remember the last edition of Village Life, you will recall that I made an appeal for volunteers to help with (1) Joining our Council and (2) Joining our Community Speedwatch Group.

! SUCCESS ! I am delighted to advise that we have TWO new members of our Speedwatch Group. Thank you for your support but another couple would be the icing on the cake, so please come forward and volunteer. The duties really are not difficult or strenuous.

24 hours before writing this missive we also received positive interest in the position of Parish Councillor, so fingers crossed that we can achieve a full house.

I know that we have many parishioners who walk their dogs across the village and in the Autumn we installed around 20 new 'Dog Fouling' signs to remind owners of their responsibility to keep our pavements clean. As someone who walks Ellesmere Road and adjoining pavements I have seen a noticeable improvement, so the signs must be working. Of course, I haven't walked every pavement, so if anybody has a particular area that needs a sign (we have a couple spare), then please let us know by contacting our Parish Clerk Edward Davies: <u>clerk@stmartinsparishcouncil.gov.uk</u>

You will have also seen our efforts to gauge public feedback concerning a MUGA (**M**ulti **U**ser **G**ames **A**rea) within our village. The feedback we have received has been really helpful. As of writing this section (early January) we have 120 paper forms and 13 on-line forms completed and will soon be liaising with the school and pupils for their additional input.

We have been working with County Councillor Steve Davenport and Shropshire long-awaited Counicl agree the to improvements for the roundabout by Stan's. At last, the work has been completed and you will also have seen the completion of working street lamps along Overton and Ellesmere Road. It has taken a long time and a lot of hair-pulling to reach this position and our thanks again go to County Councillor Steve Davenport for his application of continual pressure on the Council.

Report from St Martins Parish Council Clerk

The last meeting of St Martins Parish Council was held in St Martins Village Hall on Thursday 11th January 2024. Unfortunately, during the Christmas and New Year period very little gets processed due to Councils and businesses being closed.

Concern has been raised over parking issues by the school. Firstly, there seems to be an increase of parents at the start and end of the school day now parking on the grass verges depositing mud on the road when leaving and damaging the grass verges. Secondly, there seems to be an increase during the day of visitors coming into school and parking on the road adjacent to the school when there are adequate spaces in the school main car park. The Head of the school has been notified of these concerns and asked if she could look into these issues and advise what steps, if possible, can be taken to resolve these issues.

One of the main discussions concerned a planning application for a modification of Section 106 agreement in Irvine Gardens. Previously Shropshire Councils Planning Department had refused this application, on the grounds that the details of how the money secured is to be spent are vague with little reassurance that there would be a benefit to St Martins, despite the fact that the parish council had carried out a house to house survey on all properties in Irvine Gardens with the majority stating that they did not want a play area on this site as there was already a suitable site for all age groups on an area adjacent to St Martins Village Hall.

During the last few weeks, another survey has been carried out on what play facilities families would like in St Martins. Most Teenagers so far contacted have stressed the importance of having a suitable Teenage Shelter with a roof, seating and hard standing area which will allow teenagers to learn the dynamics of relationships and understand what constitute a good friendship which helps youngsters to make successful relationship choices in the future. Therefore, the Parish Council again supports this application adding that they will spend the Open Space Capital Sum of £26,655.00 on a Teenage Shelter in an area of the existing play area next to St Martins Village Hall which will be covered by an additional CCTV from the Village Hall.

Following a meeting the Chairman had with our Police & Crime Commissioner, an application has been made for funding through the Safer Roads Grant Scheme. If successful a further three Speed Indicator Devices (SIDS) will be positioned, two in the centre of the village and one on the exit of the village on Moors Bank.

Work is now in hand on setting a Parish Council budget and precept for the coming financial year which will be reported in the next issue of the Village Life.

We can now report that the new cabling to the streetlights along Overton Road from Stans Superstore to The Keys PH has been completed. All lights with new LED bulbs are now working, except for one on the entrance to Garden Village which Scottish Power still have to connect power to. The parish council have also agreed to install additional streetlights in School Lane and Coopers Lane.

One of the main priority projects for the Parish Council is still safety issues at Escob Bridge. Unfortunately, the water leak just before this bridge is from a spring which requires major work to repair that will involve road closures. A suitable date has yet to be agreed.



cold morning vehicle safety

As the mornings appear to be getting colder and we are seeing some snow in places, this is just a message to remind people that although vehicle crime is low across West Mercia, every winter the force receives a number of reports from drivers who have had their cars stolen after leaving the engine running, while they wait in the warmth of their home for it to heat up and defrost the windscreen.

Some vehicle owners nip inside for just a few seconds to collect a bag or finish the last mouthful of their breakfast coffee - but that's all the time an opportunist thief needs. To 'freeze out' the thieves, West Mercia Police advises motorists to:

- Clear windscreens with de-icer and a scraper
- Sit in vehicles while the heater de-mists the windscreen

Drivers who ignore this advice are taking big risks. Thieves will drive around residential areas looking for likely targets - when they spot a vehicle with its engine left running on a drive or outside a home, it's there for the taking.

One person will be dropped off, gets into the target vehicle and simply drives away. Many of the vehicles are never recovered, and some - especially high value models such as Mercedes, BMW and Audi - may be shipped overseas.

It is also worth remembering if your car is stolen when keys have been left in it, you may find your insurance will not cover you. If your house keys are stolen along with your car, your home is then vulnerable too.

So, this winter, don't give criminals an easy ride by leaving your car running unattended.



we continued to cut back brambles that are overtaking the grass, we are hoping that cutting them back will weaken them and slow their march to conquer the meadows. In February we will continue to do this and even take down more of the invasive birch saplings.

Please visit and enjoy the meadows, the views from the Mosaic are beautiful, a view our friend Neil was very fond of.




