

FROM THE CHAIR

It's always going to be a "Parish Council quiet news period" when we have an early Easter and so close to the January magazine distribution. In many cases, your Parish Council is directed and driven by matters from Shropshire Council and the new year period tends to be a void with Shropshire officers using up weeks of outstanding annual leave and everything grinding to a halt. I do have severe worries that the seeming lack of County officers will be negatively impacted into the future by the current financial state of Shropshire and the suggestions that jobs will be cut, leading to even more restricted communications and action.

I, alongside my fellow Councillors were 'amazed' (I hope that is the most polite word to use) at the design of the recently modified roundabout by Stan's. Within 3 days of its completion, I sent a letter to Shropshire asking for clarification as to the design, process and approval and which included screenshots of the chaos encountered by traffic together with a plan of what could be easily achieved to remedy the matter. That letter was dated 7th February. It remains unanswered (please refer to my opening paragraph). Please be assured that we will continue to press Shropshire Council for a response.

As of writing this brief introduction, I see that daffodils have been popping their heads through the grass and which fills us with joy as a definite sign that Winter has passed and Spring is just around the corner. My own garden on Ellesmere Road has seen an abundance of Crocus, Grape Hyacinths,

Primulas etc, and buds appearing on Apple, Pear and Plum trees - probably a little too early for comfort. Let's hope that snow or frost doesn't interfere with nature and its full beauty.

My final word is to give our combined thanks to Glenn Pennington who recently retired from our Parish Council. Glenn, you have been a true and loyal supporter of the Council and our village across many years and everyone owes you an enormous debt of gratitude. The void you have left will be difficult to fill.

Report from St Martins Parish Council Clerk

The last meeting of St Martins Parish Council was held in St Martins Village Hall on Thursday 8th February 2024.

Unfortunately, we have still not received a report from the Head of the School following the Parish Council's concerns raised at their January meeting over parking issues by the school. Firstly, there seems to be an increase of parents at the start and end of the school day now parking on the grass verges depositing mud on the road when leaving and damaging the grass verges. Secondly, there seems to be an increase during the day of visitors coming into school and parking on the road adjacent to the school when there are adequate spaces in the school main car park. The Head of the school had been notified of these concerns and asked if she could investigate these issues and advise what steps, if possible, can be taken to resolve these issues.

The Parish Council precept for the coming financial year has again been set with a zero percent increase. This follows many years since the parish council requested an increase. An additional cost centre has now been included under the heading of St Martins Amenities Fund. This will be financed through accumulated bank interest following balances being invested in a high interest account. This will go towards extra grass cutting on grass verges, amenity areas and play areas following two years of very poor performance from Shropshire Council's preferred contractor KIER. In additional damaged street nameplates will be replaced under this fund.

We continue to forward any areas of concern to Helen Morgan MP. She had responded to our concerns over the flooding at Escob Bridge, and as a result, firm dates had been set by Shropshire Council Highways to resolve the flooding and pothole issues in this area. Cllr Vivienne Fisher reported that Helen had secured free parking at Shrewsbury and Telford Hospitals for our volunteer drivers when attending hospital appointments.

There are still ongoing parking problems at the school, hopefully soon the road will be lined following which there can be enforcement of any parking restrictions.

Finally, I'd like to say thank you to the team at Village Life; what a great job you do.

Motorists and walkers travelling along the B5069 between St Martins and Gobowen may have noticed some recent tree planting activity.


Working with Shropshire Councillors Mark Jones and Robert Macey, Selattyn and



FRIENDS OF IFTON MEADOWS

I hope everyone has enjoyed the perfusion of spring flowers in The Dingle. First, the snowdrops covering large areas and showing off their beauty, soon to be followed by blue bells and wild garlic (not my favourite I find the smell overwhelming plus it seems to be pushing out the other spring flowers). We will also look in the

dingle for the many other smaller flowers which can be overlooked.



At the top of the Dingle, you will have seen a number of Birch trees being cleared. This is to stop them spreading their seeds onto the Skylark mound.

In their place we are planting several types of native species trees. Clearing this area will also allow other small plants, such as primroses etc., which have been hiding under these large overpowering trees.

The Butterfly Survey will soon be starting again. We have been surveying our site for several years. If anyone would like to get involved in other sites, please get in touch with Lee Fraser – Shropshire Countryside Ranger on 01743 255956. Surveys are carried out weekly during the season at a time suitable to the volunteer.

You may have seen tree contractors on site working for Scottish Power Energy. They are cutting back tree growth to maintain a safe clearance from overhead conductors.

Shropshire Moth Group will be holding several survey evenings on 10th May at 20.00 hrs, 21st June at 20:45 and 2nd August at 20:00 - all meetings at the main entrance car park.

As you are aware, Parkinsons is a debilitating condition with no cure currently available so that gives us an issue in trying to secure the future of the group, as the committee is currently only made up of diagnosed individuals and we are urgently seeking volunteers who are Parkinsonsfree to take the group forward. It will involve about 4 to 6 hours per month.

Because a lot of the symptoms of Parkinsons and the side effects of the medication subscribed to control it are very visible, it can take the confidence of a sufferer away and they don't feel comfortable in public, can become house-bound and depressed. The last thing any of us want to be doing is taking more tablets. 
