Gledrid Roundabout & Approach roads - Thank you for your email of 28 November 2013.

With regards to vegetation, we currently have no plans to undertake environmental works at Gledrid this year. No works to the soft estate are carried out for the purposes of aesthetics, and no verge/swath cut is undertaken. However, vegetation is cut as and when required to specific standards (sight lines, visibility, etc.) to ensure road users are able to use the network safely.

This is in line with government policy across the strategic road network in England; Welsh Highways are funded separately and subject to different funding mechanisms.

Referring to the pot hole at Gledrid, I can confirm that it is in the programme of works to be carried out in the year 2014/15, however we will continue to monitor the area and if necessary carry out pot hole filling at this location until the scheme is completed.

11. Reports for consideration re Trust Land

Councillors **agreed** that the three Centre trustees & the chair of Trustees Councillor Steve Davenport remain in the meeting

The Council resolved to accept the following recommendations;

- 1. That the Parish Council should take financial responsibility for the repair, maintenance and insurance of the facilities on the Trust land other than the Community Centre building and the garden being developed at the front of it.
- 2. That a discussion takes place with the present grass/hedge cutting contractor to ensure that those areas of the grass and hedges that are not currently being cut are included in a revised contract even if this causes the cost of the grass/hedge cutting contract to increase.
- 3. That the litter picking contract is renegotiated to ensure as follows:-
 - That each litter pick should cover the entire Trust Land area, including clearing out from underneath internal boundary hedges.
 - That all collected material should be removed from the site as part of the litter pick (and preferably recycled in accordance with Shropshire Council policy).
 - That during the months from April to October there should be twice-weekly litter picks (on Mondays and Thursdays).
 - That during the months from November to March there should be one litter pick per week (on Tuesdays).
- **4.** That there should be ongoing supervision of all contracts to ensure that they provide good value for money.
- 5. That the representatives of the Parish Council and the Trustees continue to meet on a regular quarterly basis both to define the contract supervision processes and to review any required changes.

The Council **resolved** that a written record of the meeting should be kept

- 6. That the maintenance of the garden currently being developed by the Trustees should also be considered for inclusion in Parish Council costs when that development is completed.
- **7.** That any costs incurred in the current financial year are met from the existing £1,000 budget provision for "Outdoor Amenities, Play Area".
- 8. That the negotiated costs for the revised contracts are included in the Parish Council budget for 2014/15.
 - The Clerk will write to the secretary of the Centre Trustees including the above information.
 - Amy Davies, Shropshire Council to be informed that the Annual Play Inspection will in future be the responsibility of the Parish Council
