INTRODUCING THE NEW PARISH CLERK

Mr Edward Davies will start work as the Parish Clerk at St. Martins Parish Council on the 1st April 2014 he has been Town Clerk at Market Drayton Town Council for the last seven years. Prior to that he was the Management Project Officer and Deputy Returning Officer at North Shropshire District Council. For the last 20 years he has been the part-time Parish Clerk at Ercall Magna Parish Council in the Telford & Wrekin. In that time the parish council gained Quality Status and, in partnership with Telford & Wrekin Council, designed their new website. He has been in Local Government for over 20 years and holds a Certificate in Local Council Administration along with being a founder member and principal of the Institute of Local Council Management.

Edward lives in Shrewsbury, is married with three grown up children, all married and living in various corners of the country. His interests include golf, gardening and now spending more time with his three grandchildren.

Parish Council Budget for 2014/15 The Council has set the precept at £49,500 the same as last year but due to a 10% reduction in the amount of money awarded to Parish Councils by the government to compensate for the number of residents who claim council tax benefit in the parish, the council was already facing a short fall of £805 in income before the budgeting process started. This means that every household will be paying pennies more per week.

Do remember that ALL the precept money is spent in the parish.

Items from the budget; The Council agreed to

i) take over financial responsibility for the Trust land, not including the garden, the Community Centre & the storage space behind the Centre at an extra cost of £1,900.

li) to pay 50% of the cost for the grass cutting and the lease for the Football Field behind Stan's; £2,040 this year

lii) to upgrade the War Memorial in commemoration of the start of WW1 by a) buying planters and planting them up in red and white. b) covering the panels with cast bronze panels—this will protect the stone carving. c) cleaning the Memorial. This will be done in consultation with the War Memorials Trust. £4,000 is in the budget for this and joint funding grants have been applied for towards the cost of the work.

Local Joint Committee (LJC) At there meeting on 25th February the committee agreed the following grants for the parish. **£1,000 towards buying planters for the village** - three for the fencing on the War memorial and a three tiered planter for the land adjacent to the mini roundabout. They will be planted with red and white flowers to commemorate the start of WW1.

It is hoped in the future that this will lead to a stand alone committee of parishioners to look after the planters and add to them. This will enhance the village and maybe in time St Martins could enter Britain in Bloom.

£1,928 to The Community Centre 1 to purchase and install a flagpole + four flags; **2.** to provide six unemployed parishioners with training to obtain a ECDL (European Computer Driving Licence) **3.** to fund the set up and initial printing costs to produce a village magazine on a bi monthly basis by a group of people in the village.

£4,203 St Martins School—This is to support the School in the purchase of 25 E Readers. The aim of this project is to encourage reluctant readers and be promoted through a range of book clubs. The School also plan to further develop their communication with pupils and the community. These devices will be an alternative way of communication. In addition the school would like to purchase sports related science equipment to support pupils and yr 6 feeder junior schools preparing for transition.

£200 Shropshire Scouts - to support one scout living in St martins to undertake training and development associated with attending the World Scout Jamboree in Japan

WHAT is a PARISH PLAN?

A Community Led Plan is a statement of how a local community sees itself developing in the future. It sets out the needs and aspirations of the community based on the views and opinions of the people that actually live there. You may have heard them described as a parish or town plan

The Parish Plan initiative was launched by the Countryside Agency in 1999 and presented rural communities across the country with an opportunity to explore the issues facing their community and to identify which aspects they valued or felt needed to be changed. Through the process of community consultation issues are prioritised and an action plan is produced to support the implementation of the plan. The action plans contains three levels of action:

1. Actions the community can take forward by itself;

- 2. Actions that require some support or finance from outside the community;
- 3. Actions that require strategic support through inclusion in statutory plans and/or investment

from local authorities or service providers.

It is the engagement in this third level of action that offers the greatest potential for community empowerment through the opportunity to use the parish plan as a tool to directly influence decision-making within local authorities and other public bodies. Shropshire Council take parish plans into account when making decisions.

Shropshire Rural Community Council's (SRCC's), is supporting the Parish Plan Steering Group in St Martins with help and advice. The Parish Council has funding in the 2014/5 budget to take the process forward. St Martins' first Parish Plan was completed in 2007. This included an Action Plan, here are some of the items from that plan that have been actioned.

Crossing at the Doctors' Surgery -there is now a refuge in the centre of the road

Upgrade play equipment for the under fives - done

Provision of a library – Book Box has been set up

Improve existing play areas -new equipment for the older age group has been installed

Retain St Martins Post Office There is still much to do, unfortunately, despite the best efforts of the parish council there is still no Multi Use Sports Court in the village.

The Steering Group is looking to update the 2007 plan and need more input from the community so please contact the Chairman, Mrs Myfanwy Dulson on 772885 if you want to be involved.

ARE YOU GETTING YOUR 15 HOURS OF FREE EARLY YEARS EDUCATION?

All children aged 3 and over who live in England are entitled to 15 hours of free early years education a week for 38 weeks a year. The free sessions can begin in the term following your child's third birthday and lasts until your child reaches the statutory school age. Places are available now at playgroups, pre-schools, nurseries and childminders in your local community.

The Government is also starting to introduce free early education to some 2 year olds. Some free places are available now and they have pledged to extend free childcare to more families from September 2014. To qualify for a free place **now** you must be getting one of the following:

- Income Support
- income-based Jobseeker's Allowance (JSA)
- income-related Employment and Support Allowance (ESA)
- support through part 6 of the Immigration and Asylum Act
- the guaranteed element of State Pension Credit

• Child Tax Credit (but not Working Tax Credit) and have an annual income not over £16,190

the Working Tax Credit 4-week run on (the payment you get when you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit) From September, as well as the current rules, a child will also be eligible if any of the following apply:

- you get Working Tax Credits and earn no more than £16,190 a year
- they have a current statement of special educational needs (SEN) or an education, health and care plan
- they get Disability Living Allowance

they've left care through special guardianship or an adoption or residence order

January 2014 Warm Homes Discount - DON'T MISS OUT

Marches Energy Agency and partners are urging residents to see if they qualify for a discount on their energy bills.

The government's Warm Homes Discount scheme is now in its third year and offers discounts on energy bills for households on low incomes. This year the grant has risen to £135 off the energy bills to those that qualify. The scheme is administered by the electricity suppliers and places are filling fast.

Two groups qualify. The '**Core Group**' are those in receipt of the Guaranteed Credit element of Pension Credit. Provided the claimant or their partner was named on their energy bill as of 20th July 2013 they will automatically qualify and should have already received their payment. Those over 75 in receipt of either element of Pension Credit will also qualify. If this applies to you then you should receive a letter before the end of February telling you one of two possible messages. The first is that you qualify and don't need to do anything else. The other possibility is that it will say that you qualify but that you need to register with your electricity supplier by 14 March 2014.

Anyone receiving Pension Credit that has not received this letter by the end of February 2014 should contact eco@mea on 0800 112 3743 or contact their electricity provider.

The second group is called the '**Broader Group**'. Eligibility for this element is set by the individual electricity providers. Most electricity providers that supply more than 250,000 households will be offering the discount, each with their own criteria and figure of the numbers of people they aim to help. This element is decided on a first come, first served basis and schemes are already booking up. If you think you might qualify contact your electricity supplier as soon as possible.

Latest News re Broadband Improvements - High-speed Broadband will be arriving in more areas of Shropshire

Connecting Shropshire is moving up a gear as work begins to bring faster broadband to 25 new areas. After several months of planning and surveying work, engineers will be out and about on the roadside installing fibre optic cable and new cabinets that are needed for the new faster network. Work on the Chirk exchange is expected to start in the Autumn of 2014 and completed by Spring 2015. Not all premises on the Chirk exchange area will get access to fibre based broadband through the programme, current projections are that 93% of premises in the Shropshire Council area will get access to fibre based broadband by the end of spring 2016 (when added to the commercial broadband roll-out).

I then went on to join guides gaining valuable life lessons, morals and learning life- long skills in a safe and loving environment, carrying fantastic memories of guides with me forever. Now aged 36 with five daughters of my own, guides is once again part of my life. My eldest daughter joined guides in St Martins six years ago where Mrs Phillips was still the guide leader twenty years after I had joined guides myself.

My daughter was struggling with friendships and behaviour and has since been diagnosed with Aspergers Syndrome, Mrs Phillips was amazing with her, encouraging her organisation skills and supporting her to achieve her Baden-Powell award.

Daughter two has also been through guides and daughter three is a St Martins girl guide at present.

Our youngest daughter is four and has complex medical needs, there has been times when Mrs Philips has given them a lift home after guides as their sister was too ill or in hospital and they would not have been able to go otherwise, enabling them to keep some normality and routine at an already unsettling time.

I can not praise Mrs Philips and the work she does with children highly enough, she never fails to be there every Tuesday night, puts hours of work in preparing and organising events and camps, always with a smile. On top of being a teacher at Criftins Primary school, where she is respected by the staff and loved so much by all the pupils, she especially gets involved with the outward bounds holidays.

She has been through some very hard and sad times, losing her beloved husband to cancer after a very long illness many years ago, her courage and resilience inspires me.

She always goes that extra mile to help people, she has the biggest heart and the brightest smile, but I don't think she realises just how special she is.

She has given so much to St Martins and the surrounding areas over the years and I think you would be hard pushed to find a better 'Unsung Hero.'
