





Speed, keep your speeds down within the 30's. Your SNT will be out with speed gun over the next month.



We got off to a very good start, Darwin's Original at £2.95. It was very well kept and at £2.95 who can complain. FRIENDS OF IFTON MEADOWS

You will have noticed that the fence to the Horse field has been removed to allow access to the new area. The lease to this field came to an end on 1st April and it will become the new events/picnic area. Unfortunately the people who were instructed to remove the fence also



removed the hedge which was definitely NOT on the order list. I am sorry to say that this now makes the area look very sparse, nothing like the Nature Reserve that it is. On the plus side this area along with the Railway field will soon be given 'Local Nature Reserve' status thus protecting it for the future.

We hope to replace the trees/shrubs as soon as possible but that may mean September. New trees will need plenty of water and as you know there is no water on site. Could I ask dog owners to keep their dogs off this area which is meant for children and families.

The path to the mosaic is to be repaired with the stone that is piled at the bottom of the slope. The Council have this work in hand and it should be completed shortly. It was started but due to selfish dog owners who allowed it to be used as a dog toilet it was put on hold. You will also soon see work being carried out on the right side of the path this will be a scrape/wildlife pond for frogs etc., which live in that area.



The Skylarks are back in residence but again the FEW put their breeding at risk. The breeding season for the grounding nesting bird is 1st March to 30th September and the signs stating this have been uncovered since March, but we still see people and dogs on the mound. These birds are on the RED

endangered list and we should be grateful that they have chosen to use our site to breed. Last year we had an increase in breeding pairs and we should hope that this continues but the SELFISH few could ruin their chances of doing this. These same people when reminded get quite aggressive.

The **'Its only me'** brigade are probably the same people who will **NOT** clean up after their dogs. Fouling is not only unsightly it is dangerous to both humans and dogs and we have had reports of 'canine gastro enteritis' connect to the site. If you know someone who does not clean up after their dog can you remind them this is both against the law and a health hazard.

Between 1st April 2015 to 31st March 2016 our small group worked 429 Volunteer hours, these were recorded hours which are sent to Shaun/Shropshire Council but many more are not recorded. Not bad for a small group of people.

For our group to continue we need more younger members - so if anyone would like to know more about us they are welcome at our meetings and green gyms.

Finally I would like to remind dog owners that from 6th April, 2016 - ALL dogs must be micro chipped or the owner will face a £500 fine.

Green Gyms start at main/colliery entrance 1.30 p.m. on 12th June and 10th July (Sunday's). weather permitting.

And the bike shops will show the greenest way to travel.

Cutting carbon emissions is vital to stabilisation of climate change, but it can also save you money. Without it we will leave a wrecked planet to our grandchildren. Increased

severity of flooding is known to be an effect of climate change. That may be the local dimension of a worldwide problem – so think global, but act local.
